I appreciate those who attended the board meeting to voice your concerns, get the latest information and participate in good discussion. Our youth are in very capable hands and will learn more than the great game of baseball, they will learn character, teamwork, leadership and sportsmanship; all of which can contribute to their development as solid citizens. Meadowlark Park: The ground breaking event was well attended and the park renovation is now underway. This first phase is tentatively scheduled to be completed by November 2018. Rentals in SVL

Our code enforcement team is focusing on documenting rental properties in Spring Valley Lake. Our goal is to have a reliable count of how many properties are owner-occupied, rentals and vacation homes. We are putting together a procedure to help keep this practice consistent. We also would like to remind landlords to be sure you are abiding by the following rules:

1. GENERAL

1.21. A Spring Valley Lake Association Crime-Free Lease (“Addendum”) shall be executed between all SVLA property owners and their tenants who reside in any property located within the Spring Valley Lake community and shall be incorporated into their lease agreement. A copy of the Addendum shall also be provided to the SVLA office within thirty (30) days of any status changes to the rental property.

1.22. SVLA property owners operating a rental property in the unincorporated portion of SVL shall have a valid, unexpired, unrevoked San Bernardino County Rental Dwelling Unit License on file with SVLA at all times in accordance with Chapter 25 Section 41.2501 of the San Bernardino County Code.

1.23. SVLA property owners operating a rental property in the Town of Apple Valley Equestrian Estates shall have a valid, unexpired, unrevoked Property Maintenance Inspection (PMI) certificate on file with SVLA at all times in accordance with Municipal Code Chapter 8.34 of the Apple Valley Municipal Code.

Vessel Operator Permit

As the warm weather approaches the Public Safety Department has seen an increase in residents needing to get their Vessel Operator Permit (VOP) renewed or to take the test for the first time. The VOP card is a must have if you want to operate a motorized vessel on Spring Valley Lake. The Public Safety Department conducts the VOP test and renewals at 9am every morning at the Community Center. Please remember that if you are a property owner, you need to bring your current driver's license and your Spring Valley Lake Association card to the Community Center to either take the test or to renew your VOP. If a property owner wants to sponsor a guest, then you will also need to be at the Community Center with the guest and have your Spring Valley Lake Association card at the time of the test or renewal. The guest will also need to have their current driver's license with them. Tenants who pay association dues are considered Tenant Members and they will also be able to take the VOP test or renew their VOP card with their current tenant member card and current driver's license. Ten-

ant member's VOP cards will expire when their tenant membership expires but they can renew their VOP card when their tenant membership is renewed. Tenants and/or lessees that do not pay association dues are not allowed to have a VOP card due to **SVLA Rules and Regulations 2.2.5.5. Bona fide guests - include those persons visiting a member at their Spring Valley Lake place of residence. Tenants and/or lessees are not considered bona fide guests.** Please remember to read SVLA Rules and Regulations Section 5, which covers all the rules for the lake. The 30 question VOP test will be on information found in that section. You can find the SVLA Rules and Regulations at www.svla.com or you can come to the Community Center to pick up a copy. Once you receive your VOP card, please remember to keep it with you or on your vessel. You will need it with you while operating your vessel or launching your vessel at the boat ramp. Please call the Public Safety Department (760 245-6400) if you have any further questions on Vessel Operator Permits.

Well, we had decided to just go off grid and install solar to power these medians. We did not replace the electrical monument meter, but instead installed stor-

age to operate our LED landscape lighting.

We are also working on trying to get as much information out to the community as possible about projects and programs going on in our community.

Recently, we lowered the lake 6" to pour that last part of concrete at the west beach. In the picture taken in 2012, before we built the seawall, we had lost more than

half of this beach to wave action erosion. This picture shows where the beach used to be. This last part of concrete will protect the seawall and control the issue. This is the end of the concrete. No more concrete will be installed in that area.

We have also installed new gates at the beach area.



We have started the Meadowlark Park project with a planned schedule completion of November 2018 for phase 1. We are currently working on getting updated renderings of the complete park recondition project. Once this rendering is available, please look for it on our website at the Community Center, Association Office and Facebook. This will require multiple phases with an estimated cost of 1.4 million to 1.6 million dollars. On the next page you will see a rendering done in-house showing what the park will look like when Phase 1 is complete. We expect the 150,000 sq. ft. of new grass to be established before winter. Please see our new "Projects" tab on our webpage. We will have the contract available for view that includes the construction documents for this project. This project will also include updating our parking lot and access to the park, trails and building to meet current ADA requirements. We are excited to see

these changes made. So when you see our contractors also breaking up the parking lot and concrete to the main entrance to the Community Center, you'll know why. We will keep the community notified as to when the parking lot and sidewalk, as well as entrance construction is scheduled, so that it is not unexpected. We will do this via email blast, Facebook and website. We hope that you are not too inconvenienced by the construction and progress.

Phase 1 has a total contracted price of \$592,450.00 with \$270,891.00 being reserved item replacements; including Irrigation, bleachers, backstop, dugouts, asphalt (parking lot portion). \$321,559.00 is paid with Capital improvement budgeted total being saved up from 2015 to now, in anticipation for this project. The total saved is \$352,000.00:

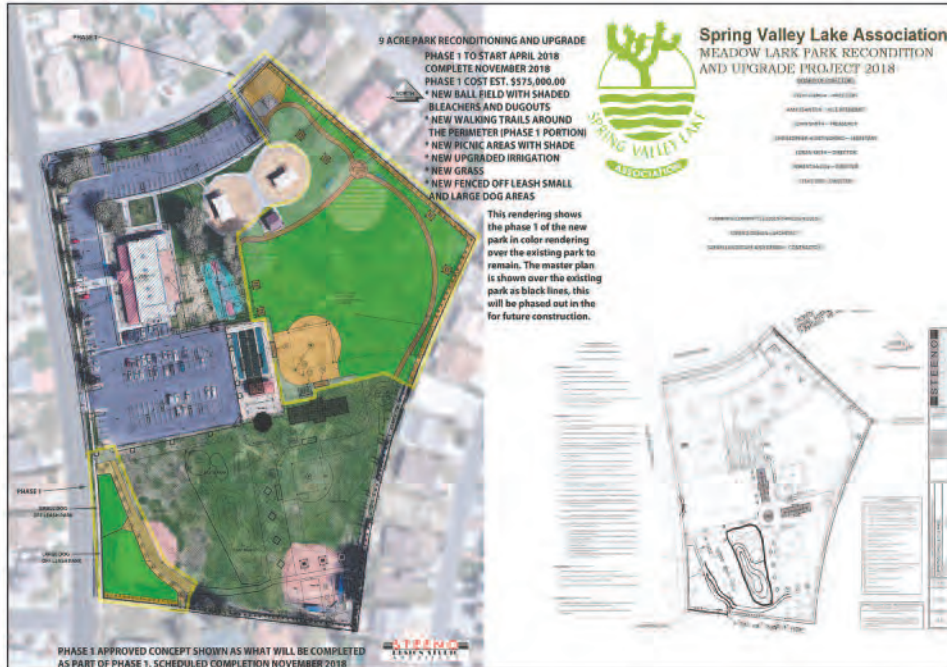

Thank you to the Planning Committee for having the foresight to start this project and doing their first community survey in 2015, before the board took ownership and improved the layout by doing another community survey in

2017. This time, they did an on-line survey to get the communities input on amenities at MLP. I realize this image may be hard to see, but you can find this online for your review.



Now let's discuss our lake and things going on. Our lake was closed to activity from Monday morning April 9 and will reopen Saturday morning April 14 for our Alum treatment. You will notice an immediate clearing of the lake when we complete the application. The lake will be safe to use for recreation.

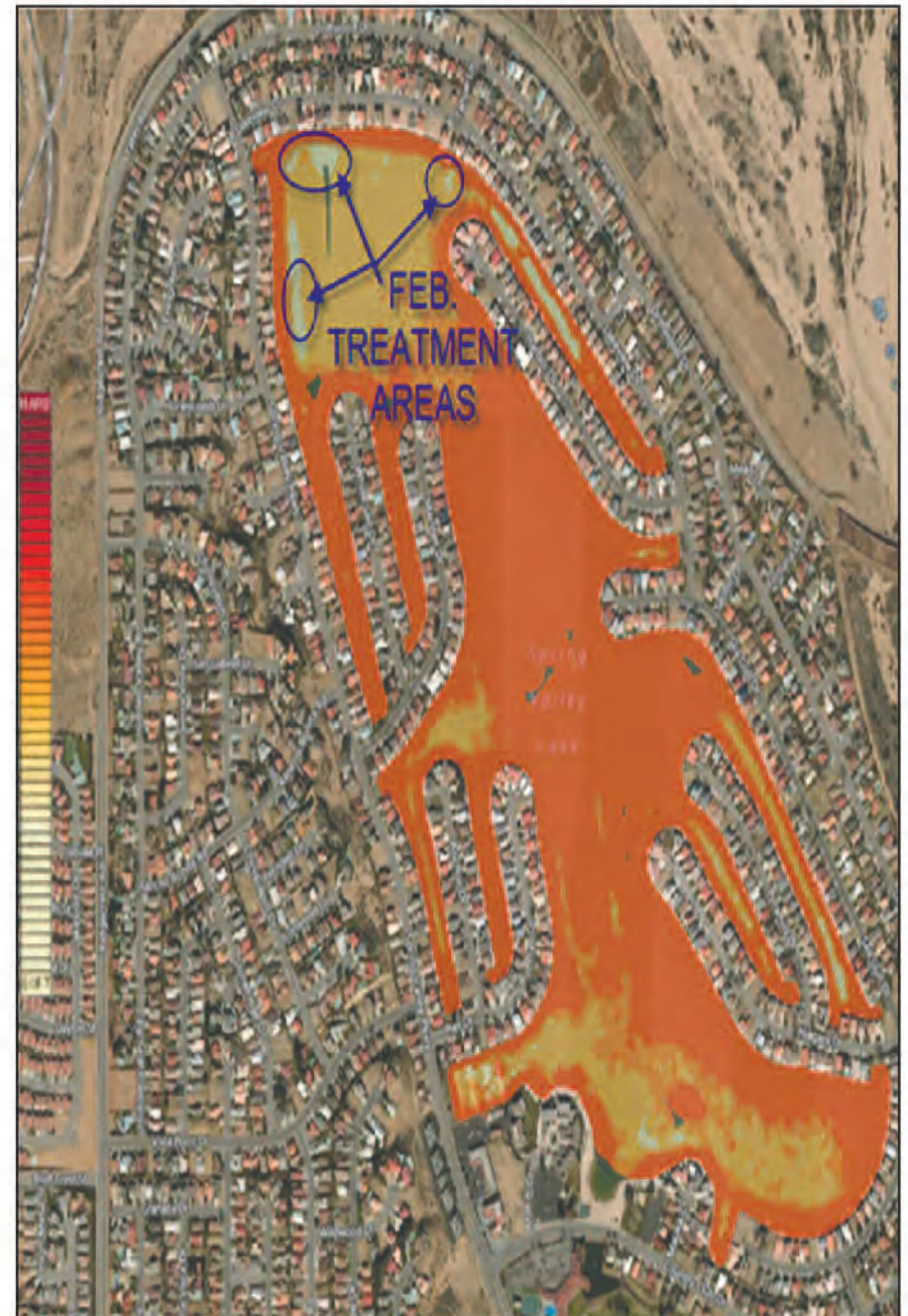
We received a planned fish stocking of 2,000 bluegill 2.5-3.5", 2,000 red ear sunfish, 2,000 crappie (Sunfish), 7,500 rosie red minnow, and 7,500 shiners from Alpine fishery. We are also placing crayfish throughout the lake to help provide an additional source

of food for our Bass population. We have placed 500 in the marina and another 500 at Fishing area 10 so far, and will be doing 2 more plantings of crayfish around the lake shortly.



We have strategically placed 50 lbs. of "muck reducer" in our lake to help speed up the natural break down of muck that collects at the bottom of the lake. Currently this naturally takes place when the dissolved oxygen levels in the water at the bottom, just above the organic muck, are high enough, which we monitor monthly and our DO levels are great at that depth. To help increase this pro-

cess, we are adding this "muck reducer" which will decompose organic matter at higher pace by stimulating naturally occurring bacteria and adding sludge eating cultures. The attached picture shows where we dumped the "muck reducer". The lighter colors show where this sludge is. The darker colors represent more dense soil, like our clay bottom.

Architectural Application



April showers bring May flowers!!! We don't know if more rain is coming or not, but if it does... along with the new flowers comes a great batch of weeds. Code has already been writing a lot of violations for weeds due to the last couple of rains that left plenty of weeds behind. If you have rocks as landscaping and did not put down a good weed barrier, you are going to have weeds coming through the rocks. Nothing is more miserable than trying to pull weeds out of rocks.



If you are putting in new landscaping, make sure to lay down a good weed barrier before you put down any kind of rock or landscaping. You will save yourself hundreds of hours of work by doing this. It might even be worth the time and effort to pull the rock up and put down new weed barrier if you are having a bad weed problem. There is the black plastic, but there is also a new black netting that is even better than the plastic. It holds the weeds better and allows air flow. Do whatever is necessary to get rid of pesky weeds. In the last couple of weeks we have received requests to allow clear lights on homes. Clear lights are allowed,

but you must submit a request to the Architectural Committee for approval. Some residents put them on their homes, wrap them around trees, and place them on their patio's. The lights are also used for security. Should you wish to add these to your home, it only takes a little time to fill out the application and submit it.



Once again we are reminding the Residents: If you are making ANY KIND OF CHANGES TO THE EXTERIOR OF YOUR HOME, YOU MUST HAVE AN ARCHITECTURAL PROJECT APPLICATION TURNED IN! It does not matter how long you have lived here, or what the change is, you need to submit the application to Eddie Vindas in the Association office. He will be glad to help you and answer all your questions. Projects started without architectural approval are subject to a \$1,000 citation. So please get those applications into the office.

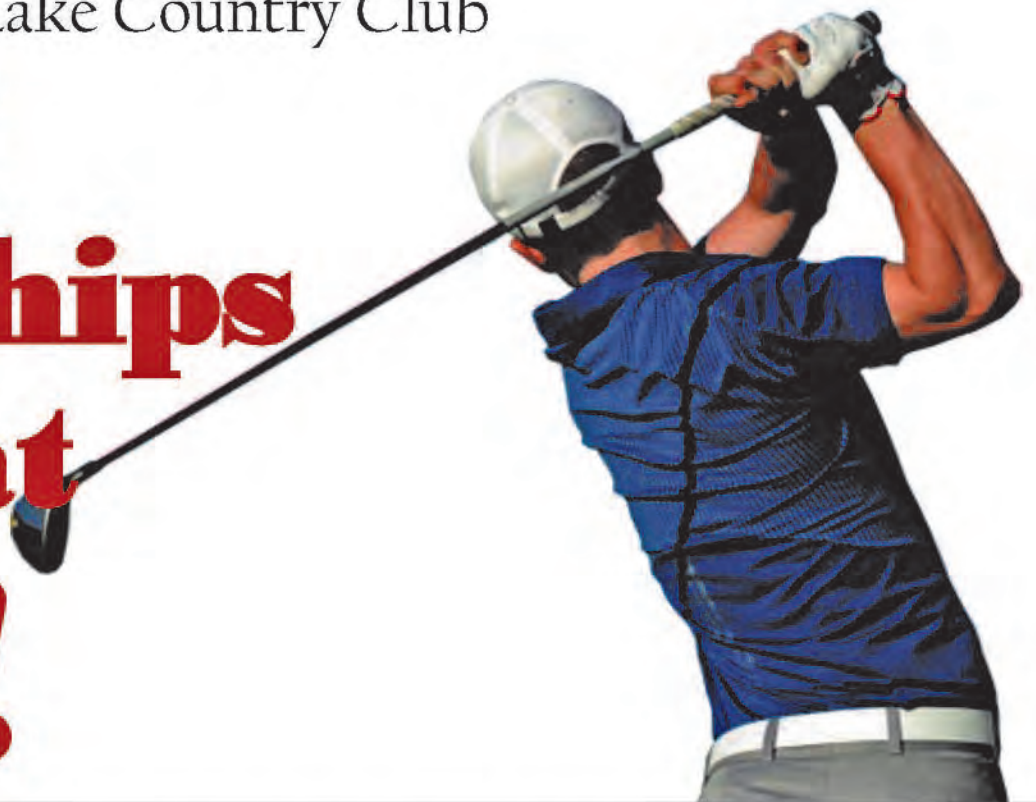
