PROJECTS AROUND THE COMMUNITY

We have seen the plans of the Meadowlark Park redesign and upgrade for just over 2 years as the Planning Committee and the Board started looking into adding additional amenities to our park. Excited to say the Board of Directors have approved this latest concept with an estimated price tag of 1.4 million dollars. We are excited to break ground and start with phase 1. Currently we are working with our Architect Steeno Design Studio to start construction documents that will allow us to phase the work into financially manageable construction phases to get to the final completion of the master plan. The Board has been planning for the park improvements/upgrades by placing funds into a capital improvement budget line item. Existing amenities with an expected life span less than 30 years are already in our Reserve study and will be funded from that account—items like backstops, bleachers, fencing, dugouts, bocce ball, etc. As we finish phases of the new Park these new amenities will be added to the Reserve study for future end of life replacement. Our next steps are to complete construction drawings, go to bid with local contractors and start

and complete Phase 1 as soon as possible. We will keep you up to date on the progress including the start / completion dates through Board meetings, our website, facebook and these articles. So please look for this information if you are interested in following the progress. The park will include the following:

- Removing and re-grading the complete park grass areas, approx. 9 acres.
- Install new irrigation using current smart technology.
- 3 New complete ball fields with 10' high outfield fencing, 1 ball field with alternate Soccer field.
- Walking trails around the park.
- Exercise stations throughout the walking trails.
- Covered picnic table areas around the park.
- Large concrete promenade area with shade trees.
- Large covered picnic areas with BBQ's for member gatherings.
- 2 Volleyball courts with nearby seating.
- 2 (full court) Basketball courts with nearby seating.
- Gated Skate Park with nearby seating.
- Gated large and small Dog Parks with covered seating areas.
- Perimeter block wall around the park separating neighboring back yards.
- New shade trees

Anchors Aweigh



Please remember the bottom on the lake is clay, therefore only mushroom type anchors or sandbags are the only anchors to be used while

boating on Spring Valley Lake. Claw like anchors or anchors with sharp edges can cause damage to the clay while the anchor is being dragged along the bottom. Please contact the Public Safety Department with any questions.

Rules and Regulations: 5.1.19. Only mushroom-type anchors and/or sandbags may be used.



Now that the late summer and fall season is upon us, lightning storms are becoming increasingly common and it is important to be aware of possible dangers. Lightning can reach temperatures in excess of 50,000 degrees Fahrenheit, which is **HOTTER THAN THE SURFACE OF THE SUN!!** On average, there are 25 million lightning strikes per year. The best way to protect yourself and your loved ones is to be aware of how to recognize and avoid lightning strikes.

avoid being struck by lightning is to recognize the signs of an incoming lightning storm. Look for dark grey clouds moving towards your location, flashes of light, and listen for the sounds of thunder. You could also refer to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration by visiting <http://www.lightningsafety.noaa.gov/safety.shtml> for more information on lightning strikes and storms in your area.

During a lightning storm one of the **WORST** places to be is in or around water. So please remem-

The first thing you could do to

ber that the lifeguards at the beach area will take every precaution to keep the residents safe. This may include evacuating the water using one long and loud whistle blast, or even evacuating the entire beach. Public safety officers will take all precautions leading up to sounding our lake siren. In the event of a lightning storm, public safety officers will sound off one very loud wailing alarm which means everyone must stop all boating operations and immediately exit the water. Once the storm has passed, the lake siren will proceed to sound off a constant steady alarm which means it is now safe to resume all activities on the lake.

Remember, "When the thunder roars, stay indoors!" However, being indoors does not completely protect you. If lightning strikes the roof of the building you are currently seeking shelter in, there

is still a possibility of electrocution that may result in minor to severe burns. Lightning can travel through the plumbing of your home and injure you, or your loved ones. So please remember it is not safe to shower during a severe lightning storm.

Even if you take the proper precautions, there is still the slight chance that you can be caught outdoors in a severe lightning storm. If this happens remember these following safety tips. Stay away from tall standalone objects like street lights, trees, or other poles. Stay low to the ground and off any objects like playground equipment, ladders, and lifeguard towers. Finally, stay in a fetal position in the middle of an open area, away from tall objects, crouching on two feet rather than laying down or sitting down. ♦

How to Survive a Lightning Strike

Crouch down low like a baseball catcher. Get as low as you can. The nearer you are to the ground, the less likely you are to be struck by lightning. But never lay down!

If your hair begins to stand on end or your skin starts to tingle, a lightning strike is imminent. Immediately get into the crouching position. Lightning may strike without this warning, however.

Place hands over ears to minimize hearing loss from the loud clap of thunder that will boom very close to you.

Don't touch any possible conductors.

The only thing touching the ground should be the balls of your feet. Lightning can hit the ground first, and then enter your body. The more you minimize your contact with the ground, the less chance of electricity entering your body.

Touch the heels of your feet together. If electricity from a ground strike enters through your feet, this increases the chances of the electricity going in one foot and out the other, rather than into the rest of your body.

Fall is just around the corner, and the cool weather is coming with it! This cool weather will allow you to better address your outdoor architectural issues such as house trims needing to be repainted or reseeding your lawns to make them nice and green again. Just a reminder to everyone, the 90 day courtesy period since the lifting of the water restrictions is now over. Effective August 1, 2017, Code enforcement will once again be sending out those Courtesy Notices for yellow lawns. So let's try to bring those lawns back to life.



Also, Trash receptacles shall not be put out at the curb more than one (1) day prior to trash collection day. On all other days trash receptacles must be removed from view.

Door Hangers!

They're back. The Code Enforcement Department will start to use these nifty notifications again. Our goal as code enforcement officers is to




have everyone comply with the rules and regulations of SVLA; and if door hangers are a simpler way to achieve this, we are going to give them another go! So don't be alarmed if you see us step out of our cars and leave something hanging on your door. The door hanger is not an official Courtesy Notice or Citation. It is just a way for us to let you know that something minor can be fixed without the extent of a Courtesy notice.

Architectural Department



Code Enforcement is always asked why homeowners must submit an Architectural Project Application for any changes done to the outside of their homes. One of the best reasons is to keep your property value as high as possible, and to keep everything in the community consistent and looking nice. As a reminder, the new architectural guidelines are in effect! There are some changes to our new rules. So pick one up in the Association office or download the pdf file from our website www.svla.com to start getting familiarized with the new and

improved arch guidelines. The Architectural Committee does their best to be fair and impartial with each project that is presented. Fill out those projects applications correctly, before starting any work, and you will never see an architectural citation. Archi-

tectural applications can also be found on the SVLA website. It only takes a couple of minutes to fill out the paperwork. Make sure to read the project checklist on the application which states what you need for that particular project.

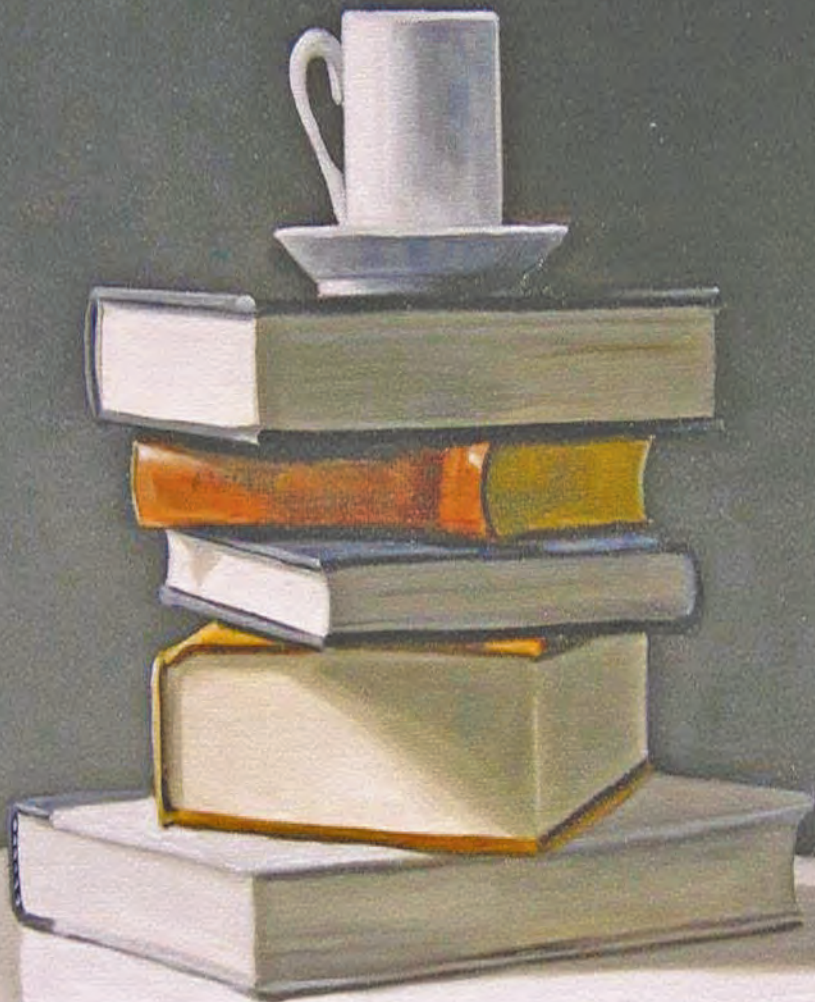
