Package Poaching

During this time of year a lot of residents will be ordering items online and having them shipped to their homes. This is also a prime opportunity for thieves to steal the packages from your doorstep or porch. Thieves can follow delivery trucks, watching for prime targets. These thieves commonly strike during working hours as many homes are empty at that time. Here are some steps you can do to avoid having your package stolen.

1. Choose a shipping option so you have to sign for delivery (and tell friends and relatives who may be shipping you packages to do the same). If you can specify that only the person whose name is on the package sign for it, make that happen.

2. Keep an eye on the package's delivery status so you know when to expect it (then you can either be home or leave a note for the delivery person to deliver it to a neighbor). If friends/relatives are sending something, ask them to send you the tracking number.

3. Get to know your carriers. Typically they have the same person on 'your route'. Introduce yourself and get to know them when possible. Having a connection to who is delivering your packages will help get better service. If there has been a problem with stolen packages in your neighborhood, tell them about it.

4. Ship the package to another location if you aren't generally home such as your office or a neighbor/friends' home. (Check with work to make sure this is allowed.)

5. Leave special instructions where to deliver packages if you are not going to be home.

6. Choose "delivery pick up" so they hold your package rather than leave it on your doorstep.

7. If you live in a building, set up

a way to have neighbors hold each other's' packages rather than leave them in a common area.

8. Insure your packages just to be safe.

Hope everyone has a safe and happy holiday.

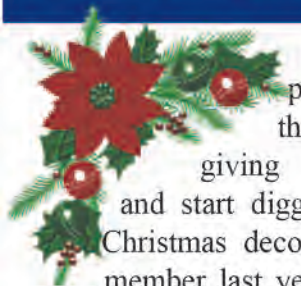

It's time to put away all the Thanksgiving leftovers, and start digging out the Christmas decorations. Remember last year how you were in a hurry to put away the lights, and now they're a tangled mess!!! By the time you get them up and lighted, it will all be worth the effort and aggravation. What's holiday time without bright lights and all the fun stuff to look at.

Should you find yourself under the mistletoe this year, you are enjoying a long time custom. Mistletoe is seen as a symbol of peace. It is said that among the Romans, enemies who met under mistletoe would lay down their weapons and embrace. Scandinavians associated the plant with Frigga, their goddess of love, and it may be from this that we derived the custom of kissing under the mistletoe. Those who were kissed had the promise of happiness and good luck in the following year.

If you're kissed under the mistletoe enjoy the happiness, but should you see mistletoe in your trees....it is the kiss of death! Mistletoe is considered a parasite and trees that are heavily infested by this plant for several years may be reduced in vigor, become stunted, and die. Mistletoe depends on the host plant for water and nutrients. Trees that are infested will weaken

as time passes. Should you want further information on this plant, search the internet or contact an Arborist for advice.

Even during a season of glad tidings and joy, we still must remind property owners about all the association rules. Trash cans are being left out in public view on almost every street in our community. We try to be understanding and give some slack, but when they are left in the streets you can depend on receiving a friendly warning to put them behind gates, in your garage, or behind the house. As we drive around and begin to admire all the holiday lights and decorations, we just want to remind you that the Christmas decorations must be down by January 24, 2017.

Along with the trash can issue, we want to remind you yet again about obtaining an Architectural Project Application BEFORE STARING ANY WORK! A fine of \$1,000.00 is a high price to pay for neglect, loss of memory, or being unaware of the rules. Please fill out an application before making any change, addition or modifications to the exterior of your home.

We just celebrated Thanksgiving and no doubt shared many things we are thankful for. Code Enforcement would love to share that we are VERY Thankful for the many homeowners that work hard to keep their homes and yards so beautiful. It is YOU that makes our

job worthwhile, and gives us the patience to deal with properties that are not in compliance. Thank you again for caring about your home and Spring Valley Lake.

We wish to bid a sad farewell to Ilene and Cliff Bandringa who are moving to Utah. They have served this community with their time, hard work, and lots of heart. Ilene has served on the Board and the Architectural Committee for some time, and Cliff served on the Citation Review Committee. We wish them well in their new journey and hope great things are ahead for them. Thank you for all you have done for us here at Spring Valley Lake. You will be missed!!!

With the holidays coming, many families will be having family and friends coming to visit. Please remember that vehicles, boats, trailers, motor homes, and 5th wheels can only be parked in your driveway for 72 hours. Please have consideration for your neighbors and residents driving on our streets when parking your rigs on the streets that they must go around.

Part of our mission is to encourage residents to keep each property as clean and beautiful as possible. To further this goal, we are asking residents to please respect the

owners of vacant lots. We have received calls from owners and residents that some of the vacant lots are being used as dumping grounds for debris, and play grounds for children. Should someone get hurt on a vacant lot, the owner is liable. When debris & bike jumps are found, it is the owner of the lot that is responsible to clean it up. Please help us with this issue and ask your children to not play on vacant lots. We hope that this relays the message that we are about helping each of you enhance your property and not about issuing Citations.

With the hustle and bustle of the season do not forget to winterize your property. Make sure your water hose is unhooked and drained, swamp coolers drained, heaters have new air filters, and you have checked your fire alarms. When the temps drop, leave some water dripping in the kitchen so your pipes don't freeze. A warm home is a happy home; and remember, if it's too cold outside for you, it's too cold out there for your pet.

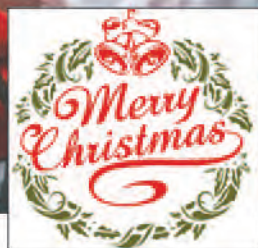

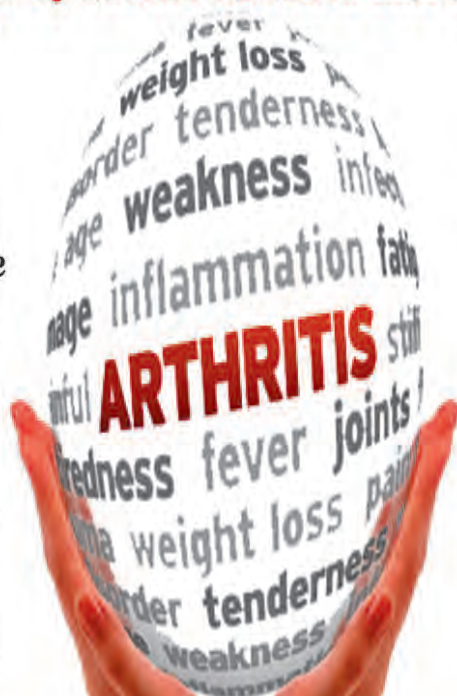

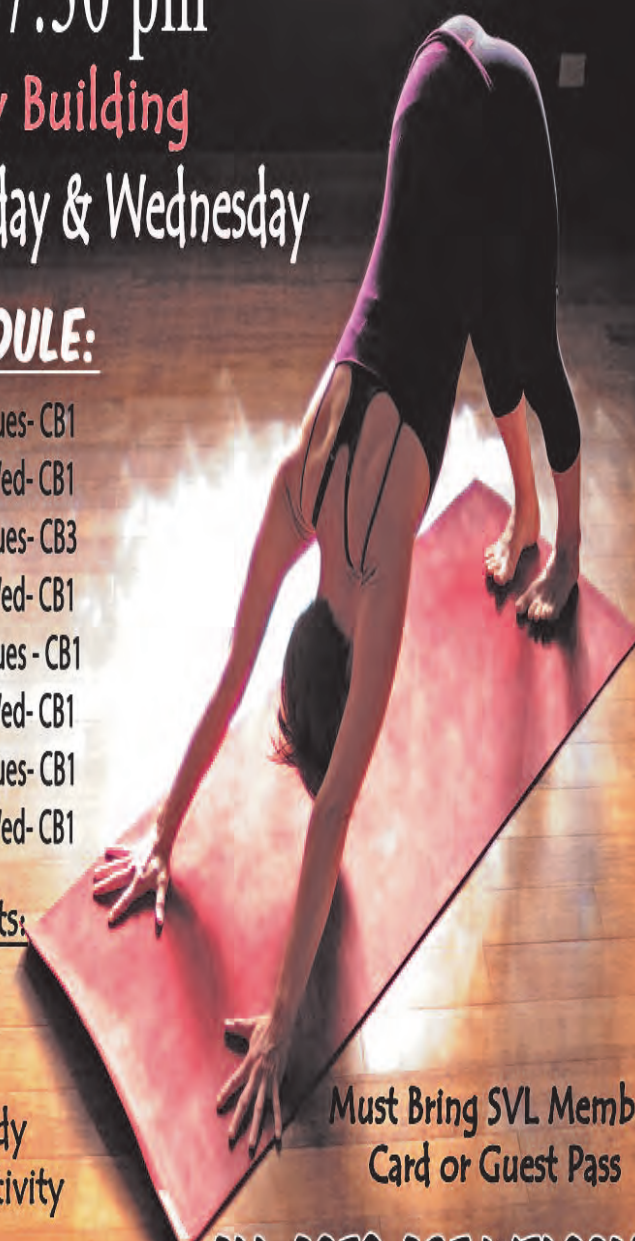
