Election day is April 30th, and it is very important that you return your election ballot in order to meet quorum. If you do not wish to vote for any of the candidates running for the Board, you may simply return a blank ballot which will then count only towards quorum. However, please make sure you follow the ballot instructions exactly and sign the outside of Envelope #2, or your ballot will not count. If we fail to achieve quorum, we must spend additional assessment funds to continue the election until we achieve the required quorum. Save yourself some money and return your ballot today.

April 30th is the end of the terms for Board members Steve Garcia and Rob McCoy, but they have both decided to run for a second two-year term. Mike Visser and I will be termed-out after serving four years and will both complete our Board service. I want to thank Mike very much for his service to our community. The new Board will consist of seven outstanding

community members from various backgrounds and experiences, and will serve our community well.

Since this will be my last President's Report, I want to take this opportunity to thank each of my fellow board members whom I have had the privilege and honor of serving with over the past four years. I especially want to thank the officers - Vice-President Steve Garcia, Secretary Amy Stanton, and Treasurer John Smith for taking on the additional duties of a Board officer.

Thank you to our wonderful SVLA employees, led by General Manager Glenn Grabiec, all of who work hard every day to make our community the best place to live in the High Desert. Meadowlark Park Playground


We have recently finished up the new playground structures and swings sets; all under 2 new shade structures at Meadowlark Park. The shade structure required the footings to be level with the surrounding ground level which left them exposed. This made the concrete footings look menacing in the middle of the play area. The placement did meet the safety distance requirements, but their appearance made us look into a padding solution for the bases. We worked with a local upholsterer to come up with a solution which is now installed. It provides 2" thick padding on top of the footing with 1" thick padding around the sides. It is safety yellow UV protected vinyl so it should provide many years of safety.



Fishing Area 8

The building is up with the metal roof structure being installed. The flatwork and footing are now being poured. We are excited to watch

the progress continue at Fishing Area 8.





At the Equestrian Estates

We have concreted the smallest stall, creating a very needed feed room for our boarded horses. This concrete flooring helps to protect the feed from hungry critters. It also will help clear up our main aisle by allowing for a secure room for those necessary items by storing them in this room.

We will also continue clearing vditch's and trails.

OUR LAKE



There are a few items that we want to make you aware of. We are finishing up with refurbishing and replacing all the lake buoys. The perimeter orange buoys are now sporting new orange LED low profile lighting. We have received our final planting of trout on 4/6/2016. We also planted 15,000 minnows and shiners, 5,000 each Bluegill and Red ear sun fish as well as Crappie. Below is a couple Crappie that were caught just last month.



I also want to bring attention to some scheduling we have for lake and beach treatment.

Beach area closure for our chlorine treatment will be every other Tuesday at 4:30pm. The beach area will reopen the following morning at its normal time. The closures will start after Memorial weekend and continue through to Labor day weekend. Also being scheduled is our Lake Alum treatment. Over the years we have decreased the application time from 2 weeks down to 5 days. Our plan is to close the lake from May 9 to May 13 during the treatment. Just to give you a brief description of the Alum treatment we do: It has been an adopted application as part of our lake clarity program to help improve water quality and promote lake plant growth to help balance the Eco system of our lake. Alum is applied in a liquid state at 80mg/l dosage. On contact with the water, the process of flocking occurs. The Floc created by the alum will grab phosphorus and sediment that is floating in our water. The phosphorus in it can no longer be used as food by algae organisms Due to its density, it will settle to the bottom leaving the lake noticeably clearer. It is the same process they use for drinking water treatment. Please note the dates in your calendars, we will also be sending out reminders as we get closer to the date. During the process the water will turn an aqua blue color and immediately we will see over 20' of water clarity. Boat traffic and wind action will lower the quality as they turn up the water and sediment off the bottom, but we have experienced clearer waters as treatments continue.

Meadowlark Park Project

I wanted to share the layout of Meadowlark Park that was presented by the Planning Committee and point out some key points from the layout we are currently moving forward with. The key points of this new park will include the following:

- 3 new baseball fields with the back stops centrally located— The south field will include a 15' tall outfield fence for Adult softball.
- New Little League snack shack centrally located.
- New DG walking patch approx.. 10-12' wide to accommodate groups. This will allow you to complete 1/2 mile loop around the perimeter.
- The walking patch will include 7 outdoor exercise stations.
- 7000 sq.ft. off-leash dog park with entrances off Rolling Ridge so you will not have to enter the park.
- 3000 sq. ft. covered picnic/BBQ area.
- 1—2 pickle ball courts.
- · Batting cage

These key features are not all, but are the main ones and, of course, will include new sod, irrigation, LED pathway lighting, concrete pathways, large planter areas, etc..

We are currently working closely with the County and looking to start construction documents with our designer. Rough construction cost are being developed to come up with a phased schedule that will meet our budgeting. We are looking forward to break ground late this summer.

They say April Showers will bring May flowers, so we should be getting some nice blooms for Mother's Day!

The weather just can't seem to make up its mind what season it wants to be in. One day the heaters are on, and the next we have the windows open.

Soon enough we will be complaining about the heat wondering what happened to spring. Spring time seems to be that period when we all try to come alive after winter slacking. We begin to clean the inside of the house, and tackle the poor ol' garage and shed.

We sure encourage Homeowners to spend time maintaining their landscaping. We want to share CSA 64's Watering Schedule just as a reminder. The schedule requires property owners to water based on odd and even address numbers:

Even numbers water on -Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday

Odd numbers water on -Wednesday, Friday, and Sunday

They also advise that the best time for lawn watering is twice, between 11 p.m. and 4 a.m. They advise staggering times helps the lawn to absorb the water fully.

We see many lawns that have been just totally let go and are turning to dirt. Please be aware that we are writing these lawns, due to being nothing but weeds. Brown, yellow, and dead grass is one thing, but a

yard full of weeds is going to cost you a violation. We are also writing trees and bushes that are hanging over the curbs. Please get those trimmed back at least to the curb, inside of the curb. As the weather warms up, please take some pride in your landscaping and clean it up.

The way drivers speed down the Parkway, you would think they were training for the Indy 500. Driftwood, Riverview, Bermuda Dunes, and Kalin Ranch are some of the other streets that you can see speeders. On NO street here in Spring Valley Lake is the speed Limit over 35 MPH.

Two Homeowners know far to well just how much damage a speeder can cause. Sooner or later, the damage is going to be a human instead of a car and tree. While inspecting the homes Code Officers have had drivers honk them to move out of the way due to going to slow. Now that is rude!!!! Drivers need to slow down, especially with spring and summer coming, and be aware of children and adults out and about.

While we'er talking about driver's let's mention Golf Carts and Scooters. We DO NOT want to see kids driving Golf Carts on any of the streets. They are not toys, and it is illegal. When you are on Scooters, make sure you have a license, and make sure you have your helmet on, and not you hair flying in the breeze!




During a cardiac emergency, 70% of Americans either feel they have insufficient training or have no idea how to perform CPR. This is obviously a big concern to us because 70% of cardiac arrests happen at home. The life you save with CPR will most likely be a loved one. Here are a few interesting facts:

· Four out of five cardiac arrests

happen at home.

- Many victims appear healthy with no known heart disease or other risk factors.
- Over 350,000 out-of-hospital sudden cardiac arrests occur annually.
- Effective bystander CPR provided immediately after sudden cardiac arrest can double or triple a victim's chance of survival, but only 46 percent of cardiac arrest victims get CPR from a bystander.
- Sudden cardiac arrest is not the same as a heart attack.

We are looking forward to our April Spring Pot Luck meeting. With so many new members, we will have new dishes to sample, and new recipes to collect.




