


# GLENN GRABIEC General Manager





# 2015: A Record of Success

As we look back on 2015, our greatest challenge was the December 2 terror attack that took the lives of 14 people and wounded 22 others in San Bernardino. While we mourn those lost, we can also celebrate all of the courageous first responders who put their lives at risk for us that day – and every day.

In the past year, we moved ahead on a variety of fronts, from community issues in Spring Valley Lake to public safety and assisting constituents. It is an honor to serve you, and I wanted to share some highlights from this past year.

## Spring Valley Lake

For well over a decade, the section of Spring Valley Parkway from Bear Valley to Huerta has been a sore thumb for thousands of residents. There were no easy solutions. But San Bernardino County, Spring Valley Lake Association and the City of Victorville were persistent in taking a cooperative, team approach to reach a cost-sharing agreement. Road work is underway and should wrap up by the end of the month.

We also kicked off 3.5 miles of road work in Spring Valley Lake, including sections of Chinquapin, Driftwood, Honeycomb, Rancho Bonita and Rolling Ridge Drive. The County also installed the digital speed signs on both ends of Rolling Ridge Drive.

As the Association looks at options for Meadowlark Park, County staff has assisted in discussing concepts in re-designing three baseball diamonds within the Association-owned park.

In the fall, we organized an El Nino planning meeting among my office, the Association, County Fire, Public Works and CSA 64. El Nino tips are available on my website, <a href="http://www.sbcounty.gov/bosd1/">http://www.sbcounty.gov/bosd1/</a>, with updates posted on Facebook, <a href="facebook.com/robert.lovingood.7">facebook.com/robert.lovingood.7</a>. We conducted public education efforts and doubled the supply of sandbags, which are available at the new County Fire Station 22 at the corner of Tamarisk and Huerta in Spring Valley Lake.

Next to the Fire Station, we built a new well to serve customers of CSA 64. It is expected to produce 2,000 gallons per minute. CSA 64 customers continue to do a good job meeting state water conservation mandates.

#### **Public Safety**

Public safety is one of my top priorities. So we again funded "Desert Guardian," a series of 16 crime sweeps over four months in the High Desert. The effort ended with 543 arrests. While I have funded these special sweeps since I was elected, they are even more important with the passage AB 109 and Proposition 37, two state laws that have reduced criminal penalties.

We have supported Sheriff John McMahon's addition of 25 additional deputies to unincorporated areas of the County during the past two years. Working with my colleagues on the Board of Supervisors, we approved a plan to reduce recidivism among low-level, non-violent misdemeanor offenders. We also updated antiquated emergency communications systems. Board Chair James Ramos and I, along with city leaders, pressed the State to restore court funding; and two courtrooms in Barstow did reopen. We will continue to lobby the State for full funding.

#### **Veterans & Seniors**

The Board of Supervisors set a goal of ending veteran homelessness in our County by December 31, 2015. While final numbers are not yet available, we are making significant progress, and I expect we will reach our goal. Overall homelessness in San Bernardino County is down 8 percent over the past two years.

In May, we held our second annual Veterans Resource Fair in Hesperia, assisting more than 200 former members of the military and their families. The County Department of Veterans Affairs is doing a great job helping local vets get the

benefits they earned -- \$85 million in new federal monetary benefits, more than neighboring counties of Los Angeles, Orange, San Diego and Riverside.

We partnered with the High Desert Association of Realtors in organizing a Senior Resource Event that offered local seniors information and advice about financial options, taxes and health care. We also assisted the High Desert Regional Council on Aging, working on health care, transportation and nutrition issues.

#### **County Operations**

The County Board of Supervisors implemented fiscally sound policies and passed a balanced county budget that is \$165.2 million smaller than the previous budget. Plus, the County's general purpose reserve fund is \$88.7 million, a 14 percent rainy-day fund. We also addressed pension obligations. The County budget and 5-year forecast includes full funding of the County's required pension contribution. Pension benefits are not increasing.

In the coming year, as in the past, we will continue the "Lovingood Listens" community meetings. In the meantime, if you have an issue or concern, please contact my office at (760) 995-8100 or email me at SupervisorLovingood@SBCounty.gov. May you have a happy and prosperous 2016.





has made increased efforts to prevent the transfer of invasive mussels into our lake from other infested waters nearby. Both Quagga and Zebra mussels pose a threat to Spring Valley Lake's ecosystem, water intake systems and YOUR vessel.

Here are the steps that SVLA has taken to protect your lake:

- The Public Safety Department has provided additional training to their staff regarding the dangers of invasive mussels, how to identify them and spot the signs of an infestation. This training has been dispersed with all Public Safety personnel including lifeguards, seasonal/beach officers, patrol staff, dispatchers and Supervisor's.
- · The department has implemented a vessel tagging system to coordinate with our standard invasive


Spring Valley Lake Association mussel inspections. Once an officer completes a full and detailed inspection of your vessel, they will place a mussel inspection tag through the 'D-ring' of your vessel and the 'O-ring' of your trailer clip. This will aid the inspecting officer in detecting whether or not your vessel had recently been placed in any other waterway that may be infested with invasive mussels.

> · Vessels that are discovered to contain invasive mussels, display the signs of such and/or contain biological presence are subject to a 7 day quarantine and will be marked with a red tag. These vessels will not be permitted on Spring Valley Lake until further inspection by a Public Safety Officer.

> Here is what you can do and what to look for on your vessel to assist the Association in protecting our most valuable resource:

- Inspect all open surfaces. Small mussels will feel like sandpaper.
- Remove any biological plant life and animal materials.
- · Wash your vessel thoroughly.
- · Drain your bilge, bait/live wells and other compartments, and then allow to dry completely.
- · Ensure all ropes, tow-lines and anchor lines are dry.
- Please allow your vessel to dry for five days prior to entering Spring Valley Lake after being placed upon any other body of fresh water.
