The manual provides guidance to the architectural committee whose primary function is to review all plans so as to ensure that the design submitted is harmonious with other structures in the area as well as remaining compliant with any restrictions with San Bernardino County/Town of Apple Valley.

report. The park renovation has been planned for a long time and I'm happy to report is now beginning. The board is very eager to see what can be accomplished in the initial phase.

Understanding the Proposed Rule Changes

Hopefully you have had a chance to review the proposed rule change involving the crime free lease ad-

dendum requirement for property owners who rent out their properties. This proposal is not designed to be anti-landlord or anti-tenant. In fact, it is pro-landlord and pro-safety. The Crime Free Lease Addendum will make it easier for landlords to evict tenants involved in criminal activity. As a result, landlords will be able to rent to better tenants.

As many of you know, the City of Hesperia has already started requiring landlords to use a Crime Free Lease Addendum. The Hesperia Crime Free Lease Addendum is much stricter in that it requires that landlords conduct a national criminal background check of prospective tenants, have a property inspection by the Hesperia Sheriff's Station and

begin the eviction process when the property owner or manager is notified that a tenant has engaged in criminal activity on or near the property. The SVLA Crime Free Lease Addendum would not require the landlord to do any of the above, but it would give the landlord the ability to start eviction proceedings if the tenant violated the addendum.

The City of Hesperia is extremely serious about making it difficult for criminals to live in Hesperia. The criminal element will soon be moving to locations where their activities will not be as closely watched. If individuals involved in criminal activity know that Spring Valley Lake requires a Crime Free Lease Addendum, they are more likely to choose someplace else to live. This will result in a safer community for Spring Valley Lake homeowners and renters.

With the warm weather coming we want to make sure all residents know that **ABOVE** ground pools **ARE NOT** allowed in Spring Valley Lake. If it is larger than a 15 gallon kiddie pool, we will be asking you to take it down. Along with the above ground pool issue, we see window air conditioners, and swamp coolers appear. Please remember before you install either one, you **MUST** submit an Architectural Project Application. While we are talking about warm weather issues, we want to mention that sun shades/covers and easy ups **ARE NOT** allowed on the docks. They are allowed on patios and decks from April 1st until November 1st.

Some of you wonder why you get sent Courtesy Notices. People judge



this community by looking at the homes. Our Code Enforcement Officers are each assigned to different areas within Spring Valley Lake. The streets that are traveled consistently by visitors, residents, and the San Bernardino County Officials, are inspected at least once a week or more. Some of those streets would be: Spring Valley Pkwy., Kalin Ranch, Country Club, Rolling Ridge, Riverview, Driftwood, Pebble Beach, Vista Point, and Hidden Valley. Code Enforcement's purpose is to maintain compliance of the rules and regulations of the Association and all its members. The main focus and goal of Spring Valley Lake's Code Enforcement team is to gain compliance from all Homeowner's. We want this community looking at it's best.

No Wake Area

Our department has received several complaints in regards to vessels making a wake in the no-wake areas. All of the channels/fingers are a no wake zone. Our lake patrol team is out looking for violators of this rule and will issue warning / citations. Please be sure you are following the Rules & Regulations. (SVLA Rules and Regulations section 5) If you have any questions please feel free to ask our lake patrol officers or give us a call. (760-245-6400)

Water Emergencies



How prepared are you in the case of any water emergency? Well, summer is here and we have more activity on the lake than we have seen in years. Our goal is to communicate to all residents to be sure that they have a plan. Before you react, remember to avoid any danger and becoming a victim yourself. First, be sure you call for help. Next, remember that Public Safety will respond quickly and

appreciate your help as a witness. More importantly, always try to help a victim without entering the water.

Here are a few questions to ask yourself: What rescue equipment do I have readily available to aid a swimmer in need without having to enter the water? Should I make it a point to inform my guests of SVLA rules before they utilize the lake? If having guests over, do I have additional flotation devices, especially for young children? Have a great time out there, but most importantly be safe.

FAQ

When can I get a Vessel Operator's Permit?

a. Vessel operator's permits and renewals are issued 7 days a week between 9:00am and 10:00am.

b. You must arrive at 9:00am as the process takes a full hour to complete.

Please note that the Public Safety Department will not be conducting VOP testing on 06/25/2016. Be sure that you or your guest makes arrangements in advance.


Here is what you can do and what to look for on your vessel to assist the Association in protecting our most valuable resource:

- Inspect all open surfaces. Small

mussels will feel like sandpaper.

- Remove any biological plant life and animal materials.
- Wash your vessel thoroughly.
- Drain your bilge, bait/live wells and other compartments, and then allow to dry completely.

- Ensure all ropes, tow-lines and anchor lines are dry.

- Please allow your vessel to dry for five days prior to entering Spring Valley Lake after being placed upon any other body of fresh water.

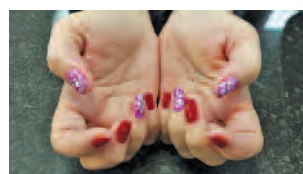
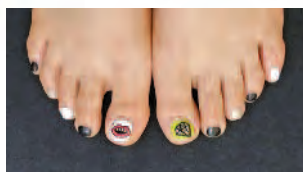

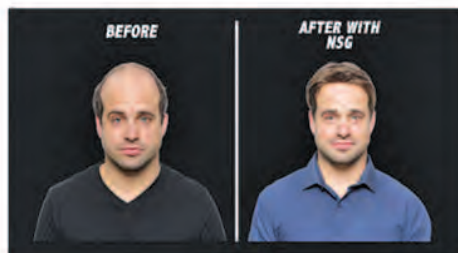
