# Please welcome Interventional Cardiologist, Dr. Chirag Mehta to the High Desert community.

Dr. Mehta completed his fellowship in Interventional Cardiology at Lankenau Heart institute in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Prior to this he earned his doctorate of medicine at Jefferson Medical College, completed his Internal Medicine residency at University of Chicago Medicine Center, and completed his cardiology fellowship at the Loyola University Medical Center. Dr. Mehta holds board certifications in Cardiovascular Disease, Adult Comprehensive Echocardiography, Nuclear Cardiology, Registered Physicians of Vascular Interpretation, and Internal Medicine. Dr. Mehta is very passionate about the comprehensive cardiovascular treament of his patients.



Following a survey of the community and much discussion, the name Spring Valley Lake Community Center was selected as the new name for our community building on Rolling Ridge Drive, where we hold many social events, board meetings, and other activities throughout the year. The survey showed over 80% of respondents favoring a name with Spring Valley Lake Community Center in it. Our staff will develop the appropriate signage for the building and we should see the new name in lights soon. Thanks to the Planning Committee, staff, and members who participated in this effort!

The county has kicked off the long-awaited Phase 1 of the road repair project within SVL and the work should be completed by the end of November. Phase 1 will resurface about 3.5 miles of the most travelled and damaged roads. We don't have a start date for Phase 2 yet, but another 2 miles of our roads will be resurfaced during that project.

During the road planning process, I was surprised to learn that none of our real estate taxes go towards maintaining county roads, including those in SVL. I often hear the argument that because SVL property owners pay more tax dollars than many other high desert property owners, we should

have more money spent on our roads. However, the main sources of county road repair funds are gasoline taxes and the Measure I sales tax - and neither of these is tied to property values or real estate taxes. Of course, the competition for these road funds is great since we live in the largest county in the United States (over 20,000 square miles). While we will continue to work with county officials to get our share and improve our roads in SVL, our thanks go out to Supervisor Lovingood and Public Works for the much needed road repairs we will be receiving over the coming months.

We get occasional interest and questions about our lake and how the water accounting process occurs, so I'll try to briefly summarize the process using a familiar analogy. Our lake is similar to a swimming pool where the bottom drain is always partially open, the filler hose always on, and the water level is maintained just below the top so it doesn't overflow when it rains. The "drain" for our lake is always kept open so there is a constant release of water into the Mojave Narrows to keep fresh water flowing through our lake. SVLA receives credit for all the water we release to the Narrows in this manner. Since lake water is always flowing out of the lake to the Narrows, the "filler spigot" for

our lake must be kept on to keep it at a constant level. The filler hose is a combination of 1) SVLA-owned wells and, 2) water that is received through the SVL Country Club from the Mojave Fish Hatchery. SVLA gets charged for all the water that flows into the lake from these two sources. In a perfect world, if all the water we put into the lake simply flowed through it and out to the Narrows, the two amounts would offset each other and we would have no water bill for our lake.

However, we don't live in a perfect world and Mother Nature takes her toll on our lake water through evaporation and leakage, just as in many pools. These two losses make us turn the "filler spigot" on even harder to replace these additional losses, and we get charged for this additional water. While we do get some allowance for these losses, we don't get enough to cover all the losses, so we must replace the extra water we use annually by either leasing it from someone like the Mojave Water Agency, or purchasing permanent water rights, like we did in 2014. This entire process is monitored by a court-appointed Watermaster for the Mojave River basin.

While our water rights purchase last year was not enough to completely cover our annual lake water use, it came pretty close this year by covering all but 211 acrefeet (an acre-foot of water is about 325,000 gallons), which will cost SVLA about \$90,000, compared to over \$400,000 in 2010 (\$500,000 at 2015 water prices). As water prices continue to rise every year, the benefit of SVLA owning permanent water rights for our lake will continue to grow on into the future. If it weren't for the allowance we receive every year for losses and the permanent water rights we currently own, the annual water bill for our lake would be over \$1 MILLION dollars a year!

I hope you now better appreciate this valuable asset we own that gave our community its name, and better understand the process of keeping it filled. It would be nearly impossible for a community in California today to re-create an amenity like our lake. It truly adds value to all our homes, no matter what part of Spring Valley Lake you live in.

The next Regular Board Meeting will be held at 6PM on October 27 in the Community Center.

#### PROJECTS AROUND THE COMMUNITY

## ARENA FENCING AT THE EQUESTRIAN ESTATES

We have completed over 1600 linear feet of fencing, over 190 post and 9 gates, throughout the Equestrian Estates Center. We completed the fencing on schedule and in time for our annual Hoe Down, which showed our largest turn out yet.

FA 12, FA 4, FA 10 and FA 15 Fishing Area 12 is near its final stages and will be open by the end of October. We will start on Fishing area 15 next.



#### **OUR LAKE**

One or our regular tasks is that we monitor and maintain all measuring devices around the lake that are either letting water in or letting water out. As part of the original design of the lake, we receive water from the State fish hatchery that comes through the Country Club. In the mid 70's, we added 13 wells, located at fishing areas around the lake, that pump fresh water from over 100' below di-





rectly into our lake. Also, as part of the original design, we let out water through our dam at fishing area 8 that then goes to the Mojave Narrows and onto Kemper Campbell Ranch before returning to the river. At each location (15 total) we monitor water flow with flow meters. These flow meters are monitored twice per week and calibrated every other year as required by the Watermaster. The

inlet weir from the Country Club is checked and inspected twice per week. This weir also requires sediment and weed removal multiple times per year and is done as required to keep the measuring accurate. Picture of the weir is below.



The water that flows from the State fish hatchery through SVL Country Club, through Spring Valley Lake, then Mohave Narrows and finally to Kemper Campbell ranch is respectively part of an agreement, during the original design, that the Hatchery flows a minimum of 8 acre feet (2.6 million gallons) of water to Kemper Campbell Ranch. Water we release, we receive credit for; and water we receive or pump, we pay for. We just finished up our water year with a total loss of 2,433.85 acre feet of water that percolates and evaporates.


ATTENTION ALL HOMEOWNERS, we know that you have been busy moving in and getting settled, so we want to remind you that you MUST submit an ARCHITECTURAL PROJ-ECT APPLICATION for any new projects or modifications to the exterior of your house. We have noticed a couple that have begun work without approval, and know that it was due to a lack of knowledge of the association rules. Even if you have lived here for years and you have forgotten, please remember that ANY modification (i.e.: planting a tree) needs to be approved by the Architectural Committee. This violation carries a \$1,000 fine, so we really encourage you to submit those applications. It only take minutes to fill them out and Ashley Yates, the Architectural Liaison, is more than willing to help you in the association office.

We have noticed that a few have stopped watering their lawns and let them die completely. While we cannot write notices for the dead lawns, when the lawn turns to complete dirt, then we can send out Courtesy Notices. At that point you have allowed your landscaping to turn into nothing but dirt and sand. If you read 6.2.2 of the Architectural Manual, you will see that "Sand or Dirt shall not be used as landscaping." You may let your grass die, but please do not let it turn to dirt.

Code Enforcement, Public Safety, and homeowners are still receiving many complaints concerning children's playing on many of the vacant lots. Mostly what the kids are using the lots for are bike jumps and digging holes for more bike jumps. We do have notifications from many of the vacant lot owners stating that NO ONE IS ALLOWED ON THEIR PROPERTY. Please be aware that when you allow your child to play on these lots that they are trespassing and breaking the law, and you are responsible. Please don't let your child be one of these!
