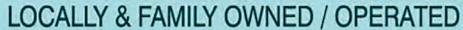



This month brings extended daylight and clear skies, offering the perfect opportunity to indulge in outdoor activities, whether it's relaxing by the lake, hiking our scenic trails, or simply soaking up the sunshine.

We encourage everyone to make the most of this beautiful season while staying mindful of hydration and sun protection. Remember to drink plenty of water and apply sunscreen when spending time outdoors.

Our community truly comes alive during this time of year, and we are excited to see you at the various events and gatherings planned to celebrate summer in spring valley lake, keep an eye out for announcements about upcoming activities that promise to make this season unforgettable. SVLA summers are always filled with fun and excitement, ensuring there's never a dull moment. Check out below to see what we've been up to over the past month.

Beach Area:

- · Additional sand was added to the volleyball court.
- · Maintenance will be removing

35mph signs behind dam and placing them on a buoy 35' out.

- · Repainted park benches.
- · Trimmed palms on Spring Valley Parkway.
- · Irrigation repairs.

Parks:

- Xeriscape at the West Beach parking lot islands is completed.
- · Awaiting estimates for irrigation at Meadowlark park pump station and replumbing.
- · Longacres and Playfair park tree trimming.

Equestrian Center:

- · Irrigation repairs.
- · Continue monitoring rodent control at Long Acres Park and Equestrian Center current traps are now more humane.
- · Tree trimming.
- · At westside small arena, light digital timer replaced.
- · Requested #14 Stall repaired
- · Irrigation leak reported by resident was repaired.
- · Scheduled inspection for all arena round pens completed.

Fishing Areas:

- · Adding ventilation to aerators.
- ·Adding thermal paint to the lid aerators.
- · Continuing maintenance on all fishing areas.
- · Reported area with dead fish at FA-7 was cleaned and area was tested as a precautionary measure.

· Reported bent top rails at fishing area 8 were replaced.

Buildings:

- Fire extinguisher inspection.
- Repaired ice machine in CB kitchen.
- · Repaired electrical issues in CB kitchen.
- The surveyor is still working on site updates (Association parking lot ADA).
- AC mini split inspection (CB)
- · Irrigation repairs.
- Repaired MLH-A AC

Grounds:

- · Irrigation repairs and adjusrment on all common areas.
- · V-Ditches are scheduled biweekly for maintenance.

Lake Filtration Systems:

- · Cleaning has been put on hold until the plan is approved by County (Dump Station).
- · 3- aerator repairs.
- · Update on Kit Installation-Maintenance began installing the kits as of July 11, 2024.
- · Currently, three compressors

are out of order due to overheating. We will order repair kits.

Lake & Marina Dock Maintenance:

- · Bi-weekly lake data.
- · Buoy adjustments every Monday and Friday.
- · Buoy adjustments for the entire lake perimeter and main body are conducted once per week.
- · Beacon lights were repaired and replaced.
- · Lake debris removal is scheduled for every Monday and Friday
- Installing 5 artificial substrates to monitor quagga and zebra mussels.

The Operations Department is always working diligently on maintaining SVLA's stature as well as keeping up on regular training videos to ensure we are delivering the best service possible. If you ever notice a maintenance related issue or concern around the community, please call the Association Office (@760-245-9756) and we will do our due diligence to correct the issue(s) or concerns.

Happy August! Summer is in full swing. Everything kicks up a notch during this season, especially around the lake.

As the temperatures rise, our activities on the lake are ramping up. This month, we're intensifying our weekly lake cleanings to three times a week, and we've already started daily clean-ups to keep our waters pristine. Additionally, we are increasing our lake samplings and have already begun our Harmful Algae Bloom (HAB) tastings to ensure the safety and health of our community.

We are still waiting for our permit to be issued to the Lake Patrol Office (LPO). County sent some revisions that needed to be made, to the architect, so we are waiting for them to review them. Once the permit is issued, things should move quickly and be wrapped up within 2 weeks.

August is already here! This month will fly by as children go back to school and the summer season comes to an end. Code enforcement's annual inspections are still underway. Residents are reminded that the exterior of their house, landscaping in the front and back (if the property resides on the lake, golf course, or riverwalk) of their property is subject to annual inspections and should be kept up. Residents may see our officers taking pictures of their house, but don't be too worried as we will be taking pictures of every home even the ones that don't have violations. Our team has noticed some common occurrences and there are a couple of things you can do to prevent them from happening:

Weeds/Yellowing Grass

The high temperatures in the desert can play havoc to even the nicest lawns. Now that watering restrictions have been removed. don't forget to water your lawn more frequently with these higher temperatures. This will also help any weeds to grow; so when you are coming home, allocate a little time to pull any weeds budding up before they become large and harder to remove.

Parking Violations

When a resident or a resident's guest parks a car, make sure that the vehicles are parked on the driveway and not on the rocks or landscaping. Parking violations in the Equestrian Estates are being enforced. All vehicles must be parked on an approved surface. All vehicles parked on your property seen from the street need to be moved every 72 hours.

Architectural Projects and **Applications**

The Code Enforcement team thanks you for your assistance in keeping your homes looking amazing. Please remember that any changes to the exterior of your home or landscape needs to be approved by the architectural committee before the project is started. Residents can make an architectural appointment to review their project and any related questions. 

The Spring Valley Lake Public Safety Department (PSD) has received several calls regarding solicitors going door-to-door within the community. In order to be in SVL, solicitors must have proper permits to solicit within the unincorporated areas of San Bernardino County. Residents can ask the solicitor to show proof of their permit. Without the proper permits, the PSD can ask such individuals or groups to leave the community. If the solicitors refuse to leave, the PSD will call the Sheriff's Department. Solicitors cannot be asked to leave SVL if they have the proper permit to solicit. There is a difference between solicitors and religious groups going door-to-door, and the PSD cannot ask religious groups or individuals leave the area.

The PSD urges residents to not let solicitors into their homes to ensure their safety. Anything a solicitor could offer a resident can be discussed outside of the residence. If at any time a resident doesn't feel safe during an interaction with solicitors, please call the PSD. The Public Safety Department can also assist if solicitors have been asked to leave the property, but are refusing to do so. We also encourage residents to report any negative encounter with a solicitor to the San Bernardino County Sheriff Department at (760-956-5001). Residents may have "no soliciting" signs on their property to discourage solicitors, but the signs must be one of the approved signs by SVL's Code Enforcement team prior to the sign being placed on a residence.

Example of a Peddler or Solicitor Permit





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

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

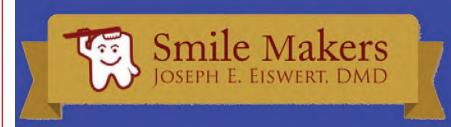
