

Positive Reviews for HOAs

How did you become part of a homeowners' association? When you purchased property in Spring Valley Lake, a common interest development (CID), vou purchased a divided interest that belongs only to you, plus a share in a common interest that is owned corporately with other homes in the neighborhood. The law requires every CID to have a homeowners' association to manage shared property and enforce a set of contractually enforceable rules, known as covenants, conditions, and restrictions (CC&Rs). When you bought your home, you automatically became a voting member of Spring Valley Lake Association, similar to a person buying a share of stock in a corporation. Mapping Homeowners' Associations: Who lives in Them and How Do They Affect Housing Values, Wyatt Clark, 2017.

More than 63 million people are residents of communities with a homeowner's association, according to IKO Community Management. (13 Statistics about HOA Communities That'll Make You Proud, 2016). That equates to 24% of U.S. homes being in community associations. That number is growing, with over 8,000 new community associations being formed annually.

While some homeowners are re-

luctant to move into HOA communities because of monthly dues and fear of "big brother" telling them what they can or cannot do with their property, many find the benefits of HOA communities to be worth it. HOA Communities usually provide attractive amenities, increased property values, a sense of community and an opportunity to grow local leadership and volunteerism. On average, homes in HOAs sell for 4.2% more than non-HOA homes, although this premium does shrink over time. (Wyatt Clark) Committee members perform almost 10 million hours of community service annually, which means that \$1.6 billion worth of service is poured into making communities better each year. (IKO)

This year, 85% percent of Americans rate their overall community association experience as positive (63%) or neutral (22%), according to the 2018 Homeowner Satisfaction Survey of the Foundation for Community Association Research. 84% of residents say members of their elected governing board "absolutely" or "for the most part" serve the best interests of their communities. 73% say their community managers provide value and support to residents and their associations. 81% of residents who had direct contact with their community manager say it was a

positive experience. 90% survey respondents say their association's rules protect and enhance property values (62%) or have a neutral effect (28%). (Data reprinted with permission of the Community Associations Institute, www.

caionline.org.) The SVLA Board, Committee Members, General Manager and Association Staff are working together to make sure that your 2019 homeowner association experience will be as positive as the national average.



CODE ENFORCEMENT

It's December and 2018 is almost over. The weather is dropping quicker than we know, and soon we will be hitting freezing temperatures at night. With all the hustle and bustle during the shopping days, don't forget to bring your pets in... if it's too cold for you, it's too cold for them.



All the lovely grass that once was green is now dormant and turning yellow. Code Enforcement is surely aware of this, but bare dirt areas in your landscape are still unacceptable and must be corrected in a timely manner.

The weather may make some violations a bit more difficult to correct than others in the given time frame, so please notify Code Enforcement if an extension is needed prior to the due date on the courtesy notice.

The same goes for all the dumpsters and trash cans that are being left on the streets; Dumpsters need to be moved back on to the property one foot away from the curb no later than one day after scheduled pick up and placed out no sooner than one day prior to pick up dates. As for trash cans, the same rules apply, but it needs to be stored away from public view.

As mentioned in last month's article. Code Enforcement is cracking down on the rental properties, insuring property owners have a current Rental Dwelling License obtained by the San Bernardino County, and crime free lease addendums signed by their tenants. This also

applies to the properties being used as short term rentals such as Airbnb's. The Rules



and Regulation do not prohibit homes being used in such a manner, it only requires the proper county license, which in this case would be a short term rental permit and also the signed crime free lease addendum.

With so many families visiting our community, there will be many cars and RVs parked in driveways and on the street. Please be courteous to your neighbors ensuring there is enough parking for everyone.



2019 Vessel Registration

Starting January 2, 2019, all Spring Valley Lake residents that have a vessel currently on the lake are required to renew their SVLA vessel registration. This includes all powered and non-powered vessels. The Public Safety Department will be out on the lake in January checking all vessels that are not registered and issuing a courtesy notice as a reminder. If you do not want to register your vessel in January, you can remove your vessel from the lake to avoid a citation. When you are ready for a vessel inspection, please call the Public Safety Department at (760 245-6400) to set up an appointment time. Please remember that once you receive your new 2019 SVLA stickers you need to place them on your vessel.

To aid in preparation for the vessel inspection, we have included the following checklist for vessel owners:

Powered Vessels

- · Current Vessel Operator Permit (VOP)
- · Current and valid state registration indicating the appropriate member as the registered owner.
- · State registration numbers

and hull identification numbers must be displayed properly and unobstructed.

- · Vessel must be maintained in a working order (motor and structural efficiency).
- · Navigation and anchor lights must be in working order. (PWC excluded)
- · Sound device (built-in air horn, hand-held air horn, whistle, etc.)
- · Flame arrestor properly installed. (PWC excluded)
- · Serviceable fire extinguisher filled to appropriate levels.
- · Red/orange ski flag. (PWC excluded)
- · Throwable personal floatation device. (PWC excluded)
- · USCG approved life jacket for every persons allotted by max capacity.
- · Ventilation or 'blower' must be in working condition. (PWC excluded)

SVLA R&R 5.2.2. All vessels must have current State and Spring Valley Lake registration decals before being placed on the lake.

SVLA R&R 5.2.5. Boat registrations are valid from January 1st to December 31st of each year.



PROJECTS AROUND THE COMMUNITY

Our team has been busy with setups for the December Christmas events SLVA has planned. We have been putting a lot of our effort towards these events early this month, while maintaining our service and work orders.



We are entering the rainy season and remind you that everything in our streets and driveways flows directly into our lake contributing to the negative conditions of our lake. We ask you to help protect our lake by picking up trash, leaves, waste, etc. as quickly as possible.

Equestrian Estates

This month we have hired a contractor to do repairs to the base and footing of our main arena and also work on our turn out arena's. We contracted with a consultant and have scheduled Equine training for our maintenance staff this month. This will help refresh

our staff on proper practices for taking care of our boarders and equestrian area. Bridge repairs and stall repairs are on going, along with all of our maintenance requirements.

Lake Side

We have cleared v-ditches and lowered the lake approximately 1 inch below normal to allow our lake to accept the water the rain provides. We adjust the level of the lake slowly in preparation for each storm. If you get bored with numbers, please skip ahead as I just want to provide some information for those of you that are interested:). Not only do we receive water that is captured from our 195 surface acre lake, but we also receive water run off from 9 sq. miles around our lake from streets and storm drains. We lower the lake not by draining more water, but just by adjusting our pumps. We will lower the amount of water we pump into the lake from our wells as each day we receive continuous water from the Country Club in the amount of about 2.4 million gallons. We also release about 2.3 million gallons per day to the Majove Narrows Regional Park. Because in winter we are only losing about 1.6 million to mostly evaporation, we can lower the lake without increasing the outflow. This past storm we received over 10 million gallons of water in our lake with only 1.34" of rainfall.

Some of the routine annual maintenance we have scheduled this winter are dock repairs, buoy repair, which include painting and placing all buoy's, as well as repairing the lights on each buoy.

We have received our 3rd trout stocking, which puts us at 5,000lbs of 1 to 1-1/2 pounders for this season. I have beard that these trout

son. I have heard that these trout school up and circle the lake constantly moving. I have also heard some people catching a couple trout over 2 lbs.




Over the past few year we have been adding artificial fish habitat structures for our small fish similar to this picture. We will be adding at least 20 more this year. We have started our informational campaign to the community regarding the lake lowering and liner repairs. (see the flyer on the cover of this Breeze issue for details.)

We will start lowering the lake on January 15, 2019. We will enforce a no wake throughout the entire lake starting on Feb. 3, 2019. We expect to start work on the liner repairs the week of February 18, 2019. These repairs have been prioritized from a liner study the Association did in 2013. We will re-evaluate the priority list and work on areas by priority of condition. These repairs will be scheduled every other year as structured per our reserves. We will be in contact with the home owners that will be directly affected by the repairs. We will keep the information and details flowing out from all of our media sources until we complete the work in March of 2019.


The custom backstops and dugouts are finally being installed. We look forward to moving onto phase 2 of this project.
