

As we gear up to the summer season and all of the events we will be conducting, you may see many new staff faces out there. We regularly hire several lifeguards, lifeguard supervisors and public safety officers for the summer season. Our regular staff folks know many of the community members by sight, but these seasonal officers may not. Please be patient if these new folks request your membership cards for entry to the beach and other event locations.

Our Code Enforcement team now consists of 4 officers. We have had a significant increase in the number of courtesy notices we send out. This time of year, especially after all of the rain we had, weeds are everywhere! Our maintenance folks are trying to keep up with them on association property as I'm sure you are on your properties. If you receive a courtesy notice, remember, it is just that; a friendly reminder. We all want to keep our properties looking great, but this vear is more challenging because of the rain. We understand!

Slips are going fast! If you want to rent a slip for the season, get in here quick! Last year we had a waiting list of about 25 boaters which hasn't happened in many years. With regard to boat registrations, one of the requirements is to have an inspection of your boat done by Public Safety. This is a time-consuming process; so we recommend you do it before the big Memorial Day crush! We do not want anyone to miss out on a fun-filled weekend.

PROJECTS AROUND THE COMMUNITY

Some projects are coming to completion and some of these projects I have been talking about for a couple months now. As we work on these amenities, we take pride in doing a great job and saving the community money by doing as much as we can with our own staff. Although this adds to the overall construction time; as we are pulled away by emergency work orders and scheduling regular and general maintenance to our list, the overall outcome of our crews work hits the goals with pride. Fishing Area 10 is in its final stages of completion. It is currently open for use with a few items going in this month. This fishing area will receive our first pet friendly ADA drinking fountain. This drinking

fountain was made in house using our certified welder. These types of drinking fountains can be purchased from \$2,700 to \$4,200. Our staff designed and built this drinking fountain for under \$600 and will allow us to add these around the community for a huge savings. We have added some benches w/small tables

for you to enjoy a good book or lunch while admiring the view. This fishing area has been adopted by the Spring Valley Lake Lions Club; and a park bench that was donated by the SVL Lions Club will be installed. Finally, we will add shade structures over the picnic tables to finish up this fishing area.



Our crews have built and installed a new awning on the Community Center building. This awning covers the only open entrance door that also happens to be on the south side of the building, which



receives direct sun all day, making the handle too hot to touch during the summer. This new awning will provide shade throughout most of the day on that door. We have also finished the beach and it looks great. We have also



added a permanent shade structure that matches the lifeguard tower look at the west beach for checking passes during the summer at that gate.



I would also like to take this moment to honor 3 of our crew celebrating an anniversary with SVLA. Joe Echeverria has been with us for 17 years, Manuel Orduno has been with us for 15 years and Rogelio Moya celebrates 10 years here at SVL. Congratulation to these guys.

OUR LAKE

We have recently finalized the lease water required for our make-up water and replacement water for last year water use. We used a total of 2,745.7 acre feet of water which is just over our 8 year average of 2,551.6 acre feet. Temperature, wind and rainfall



are large contributors to our yearly water use. This current year we



are 150 acre feet below normal due to the rain. Fishing is great as we are catching Trout, bass and crappie

Life Jacket Loaner Program

This summer we are excited to implement a new benefit for SVLA residents. In the event that you or your guest forgets their life jacket, our lifeguard team is prepared to loan you one. We will have several life jacket sizes ranging from adult to toddler. The availability will be based on a first come first serve basis. Please understand that this lifeguard loaner program is only for the use of swimmers at the beach swim area. We will not loan the jackets out for vessel usage. Our goal is to reduce the incidents involving incompetent swimmers. Please note that it is still the guardians' responsibility to aid and assist a swimmer that has restricted abilities. Also, this year our lifeguards will be identifying juveniles that are not being properly supervised. To be clear, we are here to help, but our lifeguards' job is to keep an eye out for all swimmers. When a lifeguard has to focus on one swimmer it distracts them from monitoring their assigned area. Parent / guardians that are not so responsible will be warned and if continued will be asked to exit the water. Your safety is our priority and we want to ensure that we are doing everything in our power accomplish that goal.

New Boating Test & Boating Review

We recently spent some time reviewing the boat testing process. After the hard work of our amazing team, we are now ready to replace the outdated test. We are also excited to implement a new educational process regarding the usage of the lake. We want to be sure that each time a resident or their guest obtains their VOP (Vessel Operator's Permit), they receive the same consistent great service and not just take a test; but walk away confidently, knowing how to safely enjoy the lake.

Clarification on Vessel Towing

As the weather improves, boating activity naturally increases. We wanted to address our policy regarding request for vessel tows. When we receive a call requesting a tow, here is what we will do: First, our dispatcher will determine whether or not it is an active vessel that needs immediate assistance. The PSD team is here for emergencies and catastrophic engine failures. With that being said, there is a misunderstanding regarding the nature of vessel tows that we will generally respond to. For an example, if a resident calls with expired SVLA registration and requests a tow to the boat ramp from their dock so that they can remove their vessel, our staff has been briefed to ask the resident to please utilize other resources such as a friend or neighbor to help tow their vessel. We also want residents to remember that the PSD team does not have ample staff to service

non-emergency tows. On average, each vessel tow will take approximately 45 minutes; essentially taking the officer away from their assigned duties. We are receiving calls for non-emergency tows during our off season. (Before Memorial Day.) During summer season, we hire additional staff to help keep up with the demand and try to keep the amenities as safe as

possible. We do not want this message to appear as if we do not want to help, but merely a way of communicating a misunderstanding of an expectation of service that we provide. Of course there may be a unique circumstance that may need an exception / approval. We thank you in advance for your understanding and look forward to seeing you out on the water

the air and new buds coming alive... you know that Spring is definitely in the air! We've had rain, wind and storms, so now we need some nice warm weather.


