

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

Hello SVLA Residents!

Due to our existing situation with Covid-19, the maintenance department was off for 1 week, which was the last week of March. For the first and second week of April, they were working 20 hours weekly. Now maintenance is currently back to a full time schedule (Sunday -Saturday). Half the crew will work Sunday - Wednesday and the other half Wednesday- Saturday. Their operating times will be 6:30am to 5PM. The crews will be made up of 4-6 personnel throughout the week. Because of the rain from present and previous months, we are aware of overgrown weeds and grass throughout the community, including the Equestrian Center. Maintenance has begun weed abating Meadowlark Park. Once completed, maintenance will then proceed to fishing areas and Equestrian Center.

Edison has installed electrical meters at fishing area #7, #9 and #14. This means the water filtration systems will soon be operating. We are hoping to have them fully operational by April 17. Maintenance just needs to install

the inlet and out lines, as well as buoys and ultraviolet lights, which should only take a couple of days. The water quality of the lake is comparable to last month. Dissolved oxygen average 11.0, saturation 100% and transparency 1.6". We have noticed a large decrease of wandering seagulls; but will continue to patrol the lake for debris and feathers.


At Picnic area #1 an assigned Wrought Iron contractor has installed all lateral posts and half the overall linear feet with panels. Full installation should be complete by April 17. Once the Wrought Iron has been fully installed, a landscaping contractor will begin at this same location. The landscaping installation will begin between April 20 - April 24. The new landscaping consists of artificial turf, boulders, DG, electrical, plants, curbing etc. The project will take 3-4 weeks to be fully complete. At the small dog park at Meadowlark Park metal panels will be installed on April 21 and should take 7-10 days to complete. These panels will prevent little dogs going through the existing rod iron fence into the large Dog Park side.

The Operations department is always working diligently on maintain SVLA's stature. If you ever notice a maintenance related issue or concern around the community, please call the Association Office and we will do our due diligence to correct the issue/s or concerns!

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



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Just How Effective Are Essential Oils?

DEAR DR. ROACH: I have a relative who sells one of the popular brands of essential oil products and related equipment. She sends out many social network postings about the benefits of these products, including sharing postings from others who sell the products.

I do not purchase these for several reasons. I am sensitive to many airborne scents and have a scent-free home, but my primary concern is that she seems to be practicing medicine by claiming what I believe to be unproven health benefits. These are very costly and, at a minimum, harm is done by persuading people to spend a great deal of money for products that may not do what they are claimed to do. I am also concerned that families with young children seem to be using these products - my relative has even sent some to her children's school for use in the classroom.

Can you please comment on possible benefits/harm from these products? — J.R.

ANSWER: Essential oils from plants have been used to scent the air for millennia. There are certainly many claims about purported health benefits, but there is little evidence to support their use for those purposes. Health claims for aromatherapy should be taken with skepticism. One exception is that several reviews have found that some aromatherapies can reduce anxiety levels, and possibly some symptoms of depression.

As I frequently note, however, the placebo effect is powerful, and if you expect that a treatment, such as aromatherapy, will help your symptoms, it very well may. As such, I have no objection to people who want to use them for mild symptoms. I do object when people forgo potentially effective treatment for serious illness.

Your point about cost is a real issue, but essential oils do not have to be very expensive.

Harm from aromatherapy is generally limited to allergic or non-allergic irritation of the nose and skin. Essential oils are not to be taken internally, and even topical use can lead to problems, as they can be absorbed into the body directly through the skin.

DEAR DR. ROACH: Why are there two names for every drug? In a recent article, for example, you mention fluoxetine (Prozac) and bupropion (Wellbutrin). Clearly the name in parenthesis is the common name people use. Why does the other name exist, and why is it used at all? This adds unnecessary complexity and confusion. For example, a nurse asked me about Efudex, and I didn't know what she was referring to, as the label on the medication I had reads "fluorouracil." — C.P.

ANSWER: Every drug has at least three names: a chemical name, a generic name and a brand name. The chemical names are so complex that nobody (but chemists) uses them. I prefer using generic names, since they are the same regardless of country, and generic names often give a clue to the type of medication. Generic names are lowercase.

Brand names (capitalized) are the ones most often known (drug companies often try to find easy-to-remember brand names and hard-to-remember generic names), but not always. In the example you gave, Efudex is one brand name (Adrucil and Carac are others), and fluorouracil (or 5-fluorouracil, often abbreviated 5-FU) is the generic name.





No-Bake Peanut Butter Protein Energy Balls

Kids just know how to have fun, especially on those mornings when they wake up to the news of a school closing due to extreme weather conditions. The day without a rushed agenda is theirs to create, play, read and cook!



Mary Toth, 10, and her sister Izzy, 6, created their own recipe for peanut butter and oats energy balls.

On a recent snow day, sisters Mary, 10, and Izzy, 6, discovered the magic time of a free day, building a basement fort over tables and furniture, and reading stories with flashlights in their cozy spaces. When time came to crawl out of their imaginative "far away" world for a snack upstairs, they decided to create their own treat.

With grandma Mary on the sidelines, they rummaged through her kitchen and scooped uncooked oatmeal in a bowl, stirred in peanut butter until it was a "just right consistency," added a dash of cinnamon spice and then rolled the concoction in bite-size balls. After chilling for a few minutes to firm up, the girls poked toothpicks in each one and arranged them with mandarin

oranges on plates. "They came up with a pretty healthy snack without any coaching from me," said Mary.

As the girls discovered, when good peanut butter is the base, the options are endless for no-bake snacks that go together in minutes. Here's a more complex, yet easy-to-make, combination of ingredients for protein energy ball snacks using peanut butter that my friend Mary Clapp, certified nutrition coach and personal trainer, came up with for on-the-go snacking to give an extra boost during her day.

I make mine with natural or vanilla whey protein powder and add unsweetened cocoa powder. She uses natural chocolate flavor whey protein powder. Either way, after you mix and roll them in coconut, you'll discover a tasty cookielike treat that is full of energy-boosting ingredients.

NO-BAKE PEANUT BUTTER PROTEIN ENERGY BALLS

- 1/4 cup water
- 1/2 cup creamy peanut butter or almond butter
- 1/4 cup honey
- 1/2 cup uncooked steel cut oats
- cup natural or vanilla whey protein powder
- 2 tablespoons natural unsweetened cocoa powder
- tablespoons unsweetened shredded coconut
- 1. Mix all ingredients except coconut in a bowl.
- 2. Spoon coconut in separate bowl.
- 3. Scoop a tablespoon of mixture and roll into a ball with your hands. Gently roll ball in the coconut and set in a storage container. Refrigerate 15 minutes and serve. Makes 20-22 energy balls.
- 4. Store in refrigerator. Freezes well. ALTERNATIVE: Use 3/4 cup chocolate flavor whey protein powder in lieu of the plain or vanilla, and omit cocoa powder.

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
