Construction of the revised Architectural Manual is nearing completion; it is almost time for your inspection.

Before you put on your hard hat, let's look at the foundation.

The power of the Association, in particular, the power of the Architectural Committee, to administer architectural controls within the community is granted in the Spring Valley Lake Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions (CC&R's). Our Architectural Committee Members invest over 50 hours a year pouring over architectural applications and the architectural guidelines in order to preserve and enhance the architectural character of our community. Over time, architectural guidelines can become obsolete or incomplete due to governmental restrictions, new technology, new building and landscaping products, and changes in community preferences. The Architectural Committee and the Board understood that the current SVLA architectural guidelines and procedures needed to be updated. Consequently, SVLA hired Architect Gary Wiggle to handle the project. Mr. Wiggle has extensive experience working with

homeowners' associations and understands the unique needs of different neighborhoods.

From the beginning, Mr. Wiggle emphasized that the Architectural Committee process is an approval process. We want homeowners to improve their properties. The Architectural Manual should make it easy for homeowners to understand what improvements are allowed or not allowed and to know what information must be supplied in order to obtain approval from the Architectural Committee. To this end, Mr. Wiggle included numerous diagrams and examples in the revised architectural guidelines. Furthermore, Mr. Wiggle believes that the Architectural Manual should only be used for approval process purposes and should not be used for code enforcement purposes. He recommends removing the enforcement items from the current Architectural Manual and putting them into the Rules and Regulations. This separation will make the Architectural Manual cleaner and easier to understand.

Mr. Wiggle strived to make sure the architectural guidelines reflect the unique needs of our Spring Valley Lake community, with its lake, equestrian center, and non-cookie cutter style. He produced

several drafts, each time incorporating significant input and feedback from the Architectural Committee and Chairperson, as well as from the staff, especially the Staff Architectural Liaison.

Recently, an Architectural Manual Workshop was held for the Board, Staff, Architectural Committee and Architectural Consultant to discuss policy issues and questions. A draft of the Architectural Manual, which has not yet been approved by the Board, will be posted on the SVLA website for public review. The topic of the Architectural Manual will be on the October Open Board Meeting Agenda for discussion. A Town Hall will be scheduled for early November for public comment, prior to the Board voting on the Architectural Manual. If the community expresses interest, another Town Hall will be held in December.

As we go through the process of reviewing, discussing and voting on a new Architectural Manual, we would like to remind you that these guidelines are for the benefit of homeowners and the commu-

nity as a whole. As one respected long-time resident is fond of saying, our rules and regulations and our architectural guidelines are our gates. They operate to keep out the encroachment of negative influences and to maintain and enhance the appearance and economic value of our property and improve our quality of life.

On a final note, the current Board of Directors would like to take this opportunity to extend its appreciation to Ilene Bandringa, the Architectural Committee Chairperson, for her ten years of service to the Architectural Committee. Although she is moving out of state, Ilene has shown true character by continuing to use her experience to make sure that the information in the Architectural Manual is accurate, as well as easy to understand and implement. The Board applauds both Cliff and Ilene Bandringa for their prior service on the Spring Valley Lake Association Board, Task Force, and committees. The Board wishes them happiness in their new home.

Halloween

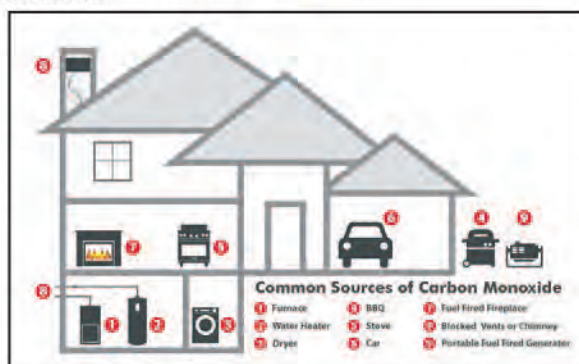
It's October already! We are keeping in contact with our local Law Enforcement and Fire Department to ensure that we organize a successful night. This year, Halloween falls on a Monday. We are anticipating less foot traffic, but are preparing to handle whatever comes our way. Public Safety Officers will be on patrol as well as Sheriff's Deputies, CHP and Citizens on Patrol to assist with any problems residents may encounter. Our local Fire Department will also be staged in the area when they are not on other calls. Please follow the 6pm to 8pm trick or treat hours. Thank you in advance for your cooperation during this Halloween.

Smoke & Carbon Monoxide Alarms

It's about that time of the year to start checking your batteries to the

smoke and carbon monoxide detectors. Carbon monoxide is a colorless, odorless, and tasteless gas that is slightly less dense than air. Carbon monoxide is found in fumes produced any time you burn fuel in vehicles, small engines, stoves, lanterns,

grills, fireplaces, gas ranges, or furnaces. Carbon monoxide can build up indoors and poison people and animals who breathe it. As the temperatures lower, we are urging residents to be sure their alarms are properly working. According to CDC – "Each year, more than 400 Americans die from unintentional CO poisoning not linked to fires, more than 20,000 visit the emergency room, and more than 4,000 are hospitalized." We also want to remind residents that when warming up your vehicle in the garage, be sure that the garage door is open enough to receive proper ventilation.

We have started construction at fishing area 10, which is located on Lakeview Dr. near Sea Gull edge along the shore line. This is



the last of the fishing area remodel that was budgeted last year for the concrete flat work. We have been working on removing old well pipes, irrigation pipes and other old utilities that are no longer used. We are using this opportunity to re-organize all current irrigation and well discharge underground pipes. We are moving the well discharge to be centered in the finger. We will add a fountain type discharge to help aerate the water when the well is discharging water on a schedule that is set to keep our lake at a desired water level. This area also houses 1 of our aeration pumps that sends air to the center of our lake. We will be

adding another air pump at this location that will place a diffuser station about 50 feet off shore of the fishing area centered in the finger. These are similar to what you would use in a fish tank, but at a much larger scale. I have included some small photographs of the work going on at fishing area 10. The air pump cabinet will be moved to a below grade cabinet to help with lowering noise as the pumps run 24hrs./day, this will also remove it from view. Our crews are working side by side with the contractor that is doing all the concrete flat work to get this job done.

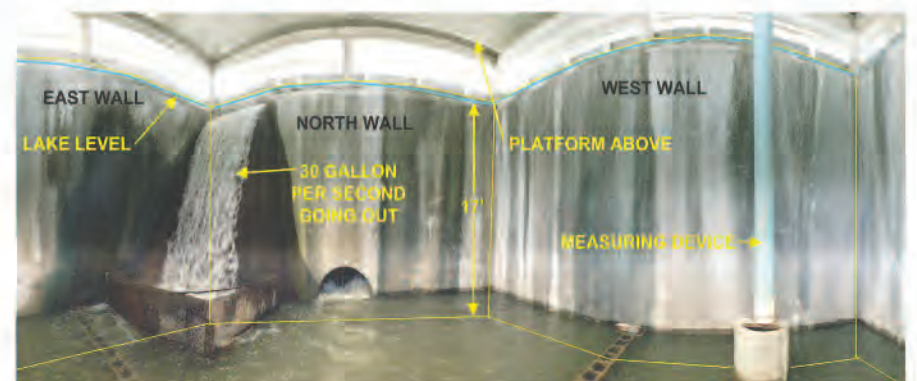
I would like to remind everyone that Halloween is coming. We will have our Halloween event at the Community center for the kids. A lot of kids will be out walking the

streets so please be careful and patient. We will have the electronic traffic boards up as usual. Public Safety will be out enforcing the trick or treat hours. The repaving is complete on Country Club, Kalin Ranch and Pahute road just in time for Halloween. The county did a great job.

OUR LAKE



One of our regular tasks is that we monitor and maintain all measuring devices around the lake that are either letting water in or letting water out. As part of the original design of the lake, we receive water from the State fish hatchery that comes through the Country Club. In the mid 70's we added 13 wells located at fishing areas around the lake that pump fresh water from over 100 feet below directly into our lake. Also as part of the original design, we let out water through our dam at fishing area 8 that then goes to Mojave Narrows and onto Kemper Campbell Ranch before returning to the river. Pictured below is the outlet. We also report this to the Mojave Watermaster quarterly. 💧

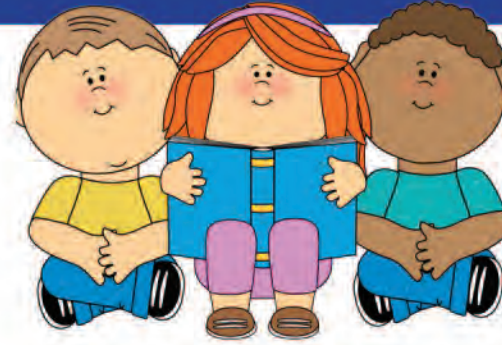
