Hello all. I would like to start off by thanking the community members that give their valuable time to volunteer within the community. I start off with this because if it was not for all those who serve on committees, members of clubs, and those who volunteer in other aspects of the community, we would not be where we are today. Second, I cannot thank the staff enough for all that they do; from the seasonal staff all the way up the general manager, Alfred Logan. The staff has done so much for this community while working alongside the BODs. Last but not least, I would like to thank the previous BODs for all their hard work and all the dedication to make SVL the most desirable place to live in the Victor Valley.

Since being elected onto the board, I have learned a great deal. When I moved to SVL I did as much as I could to find out the information I needed to feel like an informed community member. When I joined the board, I wanted to focus on communication out to the community. After 4 months of being on the board, I can say that communication has dramatically increased and will continue to increase. Please make sure you follow the association on Facebook and Instagram to stay up to date on all association events and meetings.

While preparing for this year's budget I wanted to sit in and observe the budget committee to en-

sure I had a complete understanding of our budget. Upon careful consideration of all the information, the board voted to raise our yearly assessment by \$25 for the 2018-2019 budget year. This is a \$2.08 increase per month. Even with this increase, we still have the most amenities for the investment we pay quarterly compared to other homeowner associations.

As the liaison to the Lake committee, I would like to give the committee members a big thank you in all that they have done in the last 117 days. This committee has decided to split up into sub-committees and tackle every part of the lake. The sub-committees consist of the fish hatchery, SVL County Club/Club Corp, plants and lake bottom, fish stock, and beach. Within this, they have divided projects and tasks into short and long-term goals; the Lake having both short and long-term goals. One long-term goal they have started on is the East Beach. The vision and goal is to use reserve items that are due for repair to improve and make the East Beach more enjoyable.

In closing, I cannot stress enough how important it is to get involved in our community and stay informed. It doesn't matter if you run for the board next year, join a committee, or start a neighborhood watch on your street; the more you are out in the community helping the staff and BOD, the more desirable SVL will be to call home.

NEW ACCOUNTING & ASSESSMENT BILLING SERVICES



Spring Valley Lake Association will no longer be using ProActive Professional Management. We have partnered with Consortium for accounting services. Service will begin on September 1st and will include assessment billing starting with the November 1st assessment. A welcome packet was recently sent out to all homeowners introducing Consortium, which included owner online login registration, a form for updating owner contact information and an EFT Application. 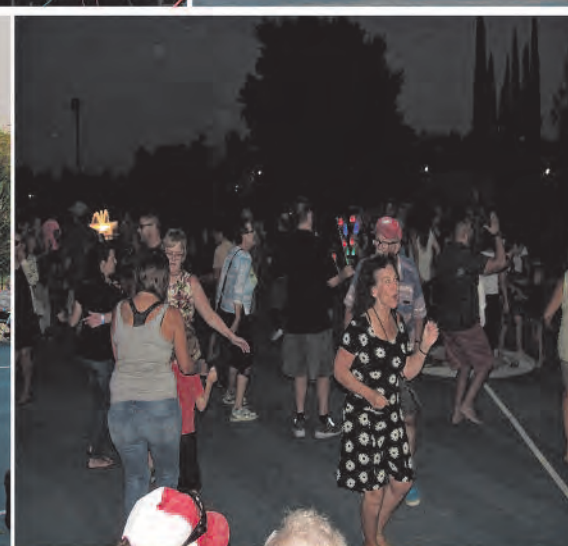


Concert at the Beach

PROJECTS AROUND THE COMMUNITY

With summer just behind us and as the kids great ready to go back to school if they have not already started, we are still experiencing a lot of use in our community facilities as we have had over 20 events in our buildings alone. There is lots of behind the scenes work happening before and after these events by staff for setup, cleanup and maintenance of the facilities for these events.

At the EQ, we have received over 300 bales of alfalfa. Working with the Equestrian Committee, we have found a new hay vendor and we are now purchasing these bales at a savings of 22%. We have completed the gazebo replacement project and this area

is now ready to enjoy. Also done at the EQ center were some touch up paint projects.

Over at the Marina, we have painted our maintenance building and surrounding storage sheds,.

MLP Project phase 1 on schedule to open November 1, 2018

The off-leash dog park received its first mowing. The grass is getting ready for those dogs to visit. We have installed 1 of the 3 gazebos and will be adding LED lighting that will be off-grid, solar powered lighting. All the irrigation pipe for phase 1 has been installed and is operational. The next few steps will be moving quickly as the contractor is in the



final stages of the construction. All the Cypress trees have been installed, as well as 2 olive trees and 1 plum tree in the off leash area, all being fruitless. Some of areas that are still to be completed:

- Ball field construction
- Walking path
- Flat work
- Shade trees
- 8 more shade structures
- Hydro seed

We are doing our weekly water sampling for the beach area, which is required for our bathing permit with the San Bernardino County Health Department. We take weekly samples of the beach area for fecal and coliform counts. We have held good numbers that are way below the level required all summer. Now that summer is over, we will no longer be closing the swim area for treatments every other Wednesday. Our

planted about 500 plants near the marina in a shallow area about 30 inches deep that is getting sunlight and also 500 plants in the fingers of the lake. These plants were specifically picked due to their growth height of about 3 feet, which will not interfere with any recreation in our mostly 8 foot deep lake; unlike the Eurasian milfoil that can grow up to 20 feet tall.

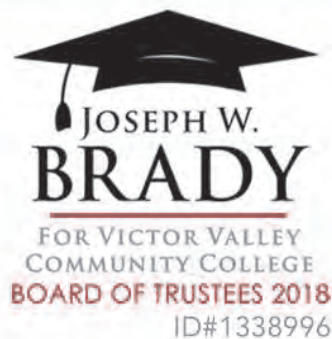

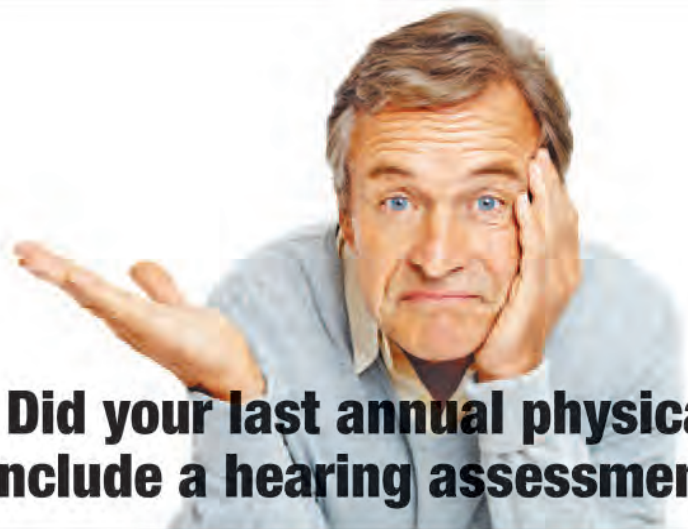


Family LUAU

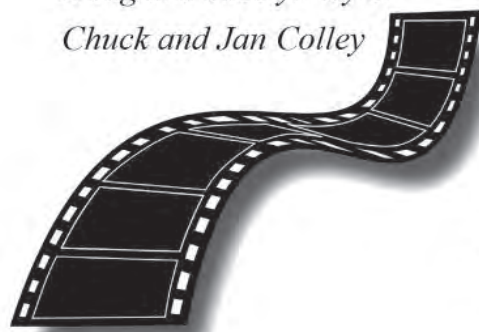

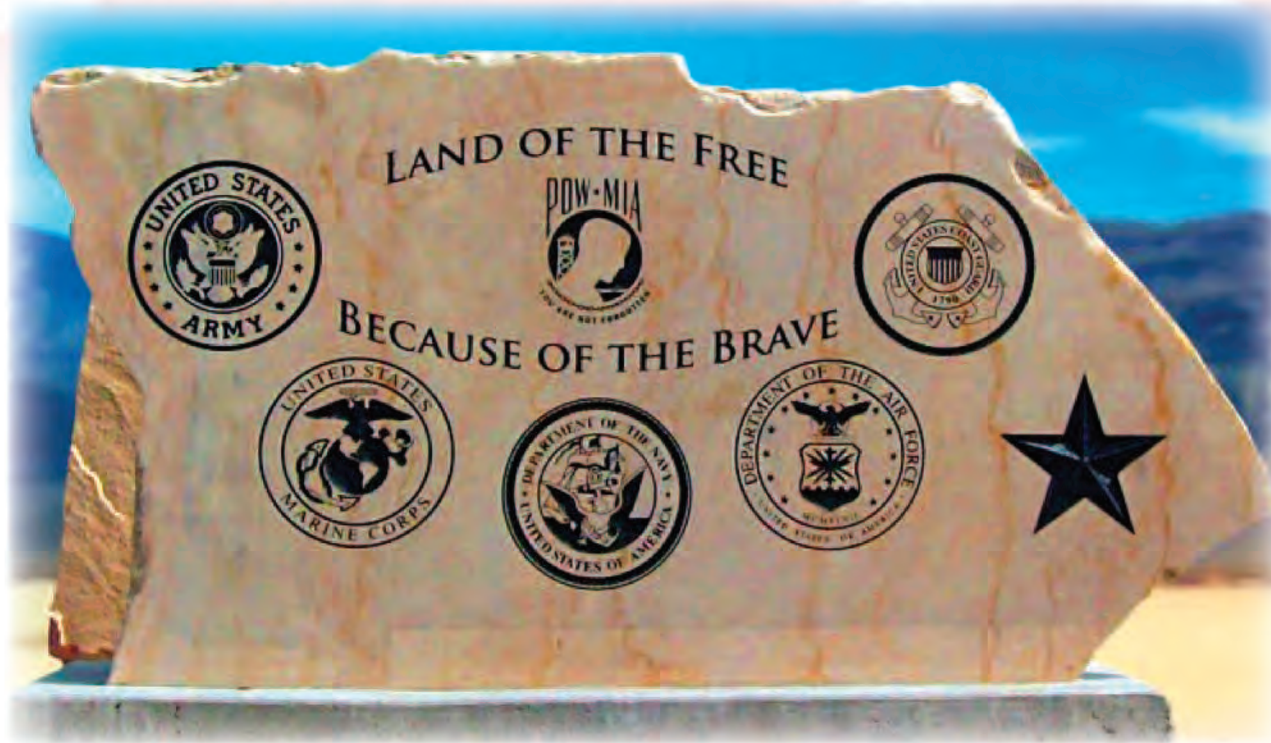

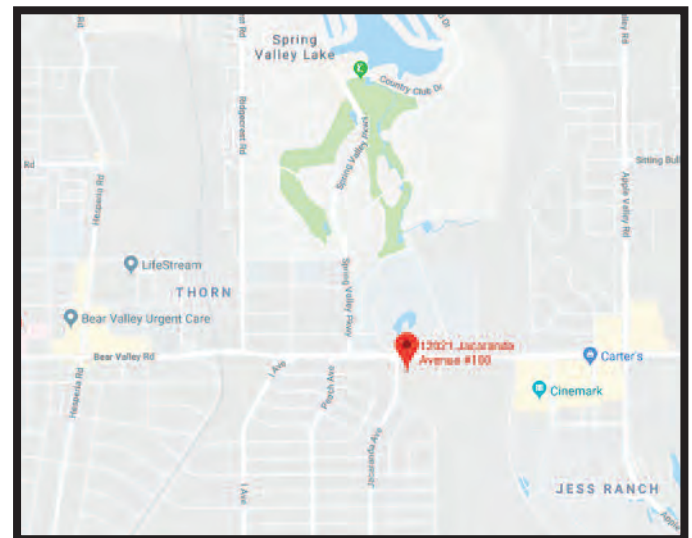
