At the June board meeting, the County Special Districts representative provided an update on the archway at the entrance to our


### THE BIG NEWS! Tamarisk Marketplace/Super Walmart



#### **Vessel Operator Permits**

Spring Valley Lake Association offers member residents and their guests the opportunity to use the beauti-

ful man-made lake located in the center of the community. While not all residents have a vessel that they can operate on the lake, for those that do, there are a few things to remember when trying to get the vessel ready for the lake.

The first thing is getting the vessel registered with the Association. To do so, the vessel must have a current state DMV registration. It must also have a current insurance policy with Spring Valley Lake Association listed as additionally insured. Detailed vessel registration information can be found on svla.com. All necessary paperwork needs to be turned into the Association office. Anyone operating an SVLA registered powered vessel on the lake will need to present their Vessel Operator's Permit when requested by a Public Safety officer.

The Vessel Operator's Permit can be obtained at the Public Safety Department located at the Community Building. Testing for the permit is administered daily at 9:00 am. It is best to arrive for the testing a few minutes before the test starts to ensure that all member accounts are valid. In order to test, a current driver's license is required. If the person testing for the Vessel Operator's Permit is not a current property owner, Associate member, or tenant member, they must have the current property owner, Associate member, or tenant member come down to the Community Building with them to be their sponsor in order for them to test. The test covers the Spring Valley Lake Association Rules and Regulation found in section 5. The Vessel Operator Permits are issued the same day to all individuals who pass the test.

Next, the owner of the vessel will need to get it inspected by the Public Safety Department. Appointments for all vessel inspections can be scheduled directly with Public Safety. Appointments start at 10:00 a.m. and are on a first come, first serve basis. Once, all necessary steps and paperwork are completed and submitted. SVLA stickers will be issued and the vessel should be cleared and ready to go out on the lake. The stickers are purchased at the Association Office located on Spring Valley Parkway. If there are any further questions regarding getting your vessel out on the water, please feel free to call the Public Safety Department at 760-245-6400.

We hope everyone enjoyed the spectacular fireworks this year. It seems that a good time was had by one and all. See you

next year!!

Summer has come in with some high temperatures this year, and everyone is doing their best to stay cool. The hottest months are still ahead of us, so this may prove to be one HOT summer. Make sure you have water out for your pets and cover or shade for them. Remember they need lots of water and shade in this hot weather. Please do not leave them chained up in the yard in this heat.

If you are thinking about installing a temporary swamp cooler or window mounted

air conditioner, please remember to submit an Architectural Project application for them. We also want to remind you that above ground pools are not allowed, except for kiddie pools. Even the kiddie pools must be in the back yards. All toys and play equipment must be in the back yards, and not in the front yards.

We are still inspecting Palm trees, so if you have not had yours trimmed, now would still be a good time to have your gardener or a tree contractor trim the dead fronds. We have noticed some dead trees, so they need to be removed.

Since we're on the subject of trees, it has come to our attention that

Windbreaker Cedars, and perhaps most other Cedar trees are infested with a black fuzzy caterpillar. They are not pretty and need to be treated with some sort insecticide to kill them before they destroy the trees.



It just boggles ones mind how each week these poor containers get left in the street, on the driveways, behind bushes, and on the side the garage. It would behoove you to put it behind the gate, in the garage, or behind the house. It would be a shame to get a notice for something that can easily be remedied.



Even though your yard my be yellow, brown, or dead, we still expect you to maintain it and

keep your landscaping in good looking shape. Believe it or not, just trimming the bushes mowing the weeds down helps keep it looking so much better. Do not let the weeds take over. You still must maintain your landscaping one way or another. If you allow it to turn to dirt, then you must somehow landscape it. The Draught has been hard on everyone, but there are little steps we can all do to help.

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION Regarding Your Vessel Insurance!

If you are a vessel owner who registers your boat with the Association or are hoping to do so in the future, please take a moment to read through this notice.

Due to a recent issue with an insurance policy, we have been notified by our insurance company that we must make changes to what is required on vessel insurance policies.

One requirement for all insurance policies is that Spring Valley Association must be listed as Additionally Insured on the policy with our mailing address.

Previously we were able to accept policies that listed Spring Valley Lake Association as Additional Interest as well as Additional Insured. Our insurance company has notified us that we <u>CANNOT</u> accept policies that use the verbiage <u>Additional Interest</u> and we must accept <u>Additional Insured only</u>. Additional Interest is not the same as Additional Insured and Additional Interest does not protect the Association.

As you are renewing your vessel registrations and/or your insurance policies please make sure that your policy reflects Spring Valley Lake Association specifically as Additional Insured with our mailing address.

Clearing up this issue prior to coming in to register your vessel will save a lot of time in the registration process. If you have any questions or concerns regarding this you can call the Association office at 760.245.9756.

During the June Board Meeting, the Directors listened attentively to the report given by General Manager, Glenn Grabiec, as to the history of the park upgrades decisions as well as where he would like to take those plans now. I also spoke to an attentive board on how the committee wishes to go forward with the plans that were presented to the enthusiastic (previous) board and (then) Board President. While the directors have not dissected the layout of the plans, they want to see the plans go forward with success. That said, the first phase of the park upgrades will be the report from a licensed project architect. Glenn had that in mind all along and is pursuing that person via bids. While at the podium, I heard a few members' excited voices when I described the off leash pet area. This was the number one item voiced by the members in a survey in the SVL Breeze this year. I expressed to the directors, since SVL Little League is the largest users of Meadowlark Park, that considerations for newly laid out ball fields is on the top of the park improvement list. The Planning Committee has recruited Randy Guth from SVL

Little League to be an advisor for the field upgrades. Combining Randy's baseball knowledge with committee member, Brian Hurst, also a representative for SVL Little League, is a promising move in finalizing the fields for competition as well as safety for the ball players and spectators. A past committee, Youth Activities Committee, had made efforts for a few years to encourage representatives from SVL Little League to get involved in the park upgrades, but to no avail. We are proud to say they are now in all the way.

The directors suggested, without holding up forward movement, we hold a few Town Hall Meetings to hear from other member who did not answer to the survey, as to some upgrades they would like to see happen. Stay tuned.
