members and Directors. The new guidelines are available on the SVLA web site. They are much more applicable to today's modern approach to construction and design and will benefit both the home owner and code enforcement.

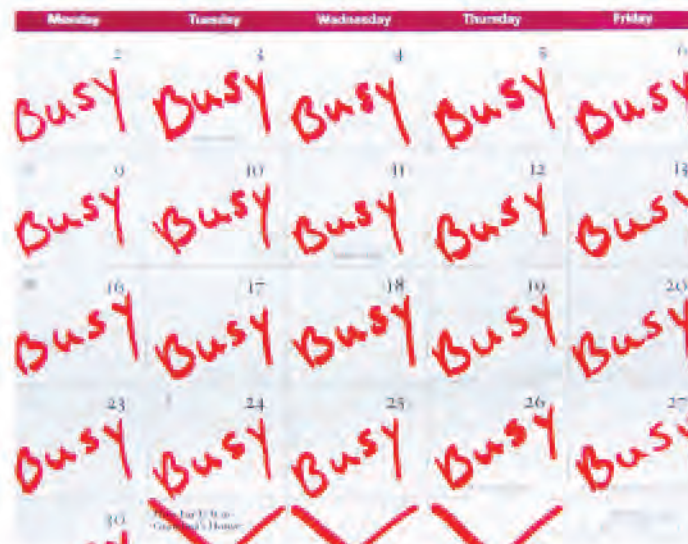

PROJECTS AROUND THE COMMUNITY

Well we have just finished off the month of June and we did it with a big bang, which we hope you were able to enjoy. From the Summer Kick Off event to the concert at the beach and finally Family Festival and Firework show, our team works together to provide a safe day of fun with Public Safety and operations working in the background to make this happen. The maintenance pontoon is used to set the firework barge for the fireworks show. We have given this vessel a new look with a metal roof and deck to protect the vessel and its occupants from the fireworks. On that note, I would like to mention that next year we will be enforcing a no movement on the lake until an all clear is announced. We must provide the firework barge a safe perimeter as required by the Fire Marshal. This perimeter must be maintained after the show while each cannon is checked for unfired shells. This year we had 5 unfired shells that you may have seen go up about 2 minutes after the show ended. Once the barge has been cleared Public Safety lake patrol will give an all clear so that the anchored and beached vessels may move.

Some of the projects we are currently working on is the Meadowlark Park plan, which you may have seen as the Board is looking for member comments. This plan accommodates just about everything that the Board, Planning Committee and surveys of the community have been looking for. To view this plan please visit our website and click on the Park plan under Hot Topics.

We have been working with CSA64 on some of the details for the new monument that will replace the Archway currently at Bear Valley Road and Spring Valley Parkway. This project will complete the parkway and beautify the intersection that has been sitting in limbo while all the planning and designing has been happening. We will keep you informed as we get closer to breaking ground, updating you on schedule and lane closures. Once this project gets started, we will start working on the Equestrian Estates entrance on Bear Valley Road to match the new updated look so that the entrance walls have a similar look with stacked stone, weathered steel logos, lights and plants.

We are waiting for our latest consultants report about our lake which maps the bottom density and water quality, nutrient load and algae colony counts. All of this info can be found on our website.

The lake committee has been working on some procedures for spill clean up and recovery to help owners in the case of a sunken vessel. I would also like to remind you that glass is not permitted at the beach. We have been finding a lot of broken glass recently and would ask that you no bring any glass bottles or containers of any kind to the beach. 💎

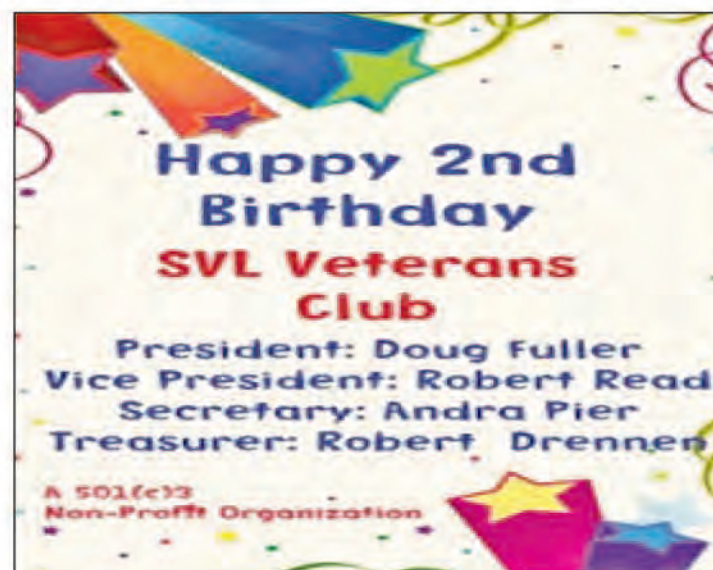

Summertime Heat

Now that summer is here and residents are enjoying outdoor activities in Spring Valley Lake, here is some important information on how to avoid heat-related illnesses.

A very high body temperature can damage the brain and other vital organs. Some health conditions can make it harder for the body to stay cool in hot weather. These include old age, obesity, fever, dehydration, heart disease, poor circulation,

sunburn and drug and alcohol use. When you're outside during the heat of the day, remember to:

- Drink plenty of water before, during, and after you are active.
- Do not spend too much time in the sun.
- Stay cool as much as possible.
- Wear lightweight, light-colored, loose-fitting clothing.

Heat-related illnesses are caused by overexposure to heat. If recognized in the early stages, you can prevent the heat-related illness from turning into an emergency, like heat stroke, which is a life-threatening condition. There are three types of heat-related illnesses, which progress from mild to worse:

1. Heat cramps are painful muscle spasms that usually occur in the legs and abdomen. Heat cramps are the least severe of the heat-related emergencies.

2. Heat exhaustion is an early indicator that the body's cooling system is becoming overwhelmed. Signs and symptoms include:

- Cool, moist, pale, ashen or flushed skin.
- Headache, nausea and dizziness.
- Weakness and exhaustion.
- Heavy sweating.

3. Heat stroke occurs when the body's systems are overwhelmed by heat, causing them to stop functioning. Heat stroke is a life-threatening condition. Signs and symptoms include:

- Changes in level of consciousness
- Skin that is hot to the touch, skin that is wet or dry or appears red or pale

- Vision disturbances
- Seizures
- Vomiting
- Rapid and shallow breathing
- Rapid and weak pulse
- Lack of sweating

If someone with you is experiencing any of these symptoms:

- Move the victim to a cool place.
- Loosen tight clothing.
- Remove perspiration-soaked clothing.
- Cool the victim by spraying them with cool water or applying cool, wet towels to the skin.
- Fan the victim.
- Encourage the victim to drink small amounts of a commercial sports drink, coconut water or milk, if the victim is conscious and able to swallow. Give water if none of these drinks are available.


If the victim refuses water or vomits, or has a mental status change, vision disturbance or a seizure, have someone call Emergency Services and try to cool the victim as soon as possible by immersing the victim in cold water up to their neck, or place ice water soaked towels over the person's entire body.

Lovingood secures \$1 million for High Desert crime sweeps, saves fire station and inmate crew program

San Bernardino County Board of Supervisors Chairman Robert A. Lovingood secured \$1 million for a series of law enforcement sweeps and other operations to both combat crime and set the stage for expanded economic investment.

During Tuesday's County budget hearing, Lovingood supported restoring \$1.5 million for the Wonder Valley fire station that serves Interstate 40 stretching from Barstow to the Arizona stateline. The Board chairman also advocated restoring \$1.5 million in funds for an inmate firefighting crew program that has been critical in battling wildfires, including last year's devastating Blue Cut Fire. Funding for the inmate fire crew had been cut from the County's draft budget.

Lovingood has been a key proponent of increasing public safety funding, particularly to beef up law enforcement operations. He thanked fellow Supervisors James Ramos and Josie Gonzales in backing his request for crime sweeps. In years past, Lovingood allocated funds for "Desert Guardian" crime sweeps in the Victor Valley. The \$1 million allocation takes local anti-crime efforts to an unprecedented new level.

"I'm simply stating the fact that

there's a need. It's a conversation that we've all touched on over the past several years and how we look at public safety," Lovingood told his Board colleagues. "If we don't shift this conversation, not only today but next year and every year following until we turn the tide (of crime), we're at great risk. Our County and each of our communities are at risk."

Sheriff John McMahon said the additional funding will make an impact.

"Supervisor Lovingood made a promise in the past that if revenues improved, he hoped to further strengthen the Sheriff's Department by dedicating additional resources to fight crime and target quality of life issues in the county," McMahon said. "With that commitment, I praise the supervisor for coming through on these promises. With Supervisor Lovingood's help, we've made a huge impact on crime specific issues in the high desert. The additional \$1 million will help in funding crime suppression operations that have proven to make a dent in those efforts with the goal of creating a safer environment for the residents in our county."

District Attorney Michael Ra-

mos agreed that the expanded sweeps will have a significant positive effect.

"Thanks to the efforts of Supervisor Lovingood we are going to be able to more effectively combat crime in the High Desert region," Ramos said. "Through this additional funding and our collaborative efforts with county officials and local law enforcement, we will make a significant impact in our community."

Lovingood said more affluent regions of the county have more revenue to spend on law enforcement. But the First, Third and Fifth Districts, he said, are more challenged economically, with a lower tax base and fewer resources. Combating crime, Lovingood said, is vital to expanding economic development because companies looking to relocate consider crime rates before investing in communities.

The \$1 million funding, Lovingood said, will be coordinated by the Sheriff's Department. As in the past to leverage funds, the County will offer to partner financially with local cities interested in participating in heightened enforcement.

Many law enforcement pro-

fessionals agree that Propositions 47, 57 and AB 109 have put more criminals on the streets. And Lovingood said the State has stepped back from its law enforcement responsibilities.

"If the State won't do its job in seriously attacking crime, then San Bernardino County will," Lovingood said.

In other action, the Board of Supervisors voted 5-0 to restore funding for inmate fire crews. In 2016, inmate crews responded to 738 emergency calls, with that number expected to top 1,000 calls this year. Inmate crews also logged 10,560 hours of work in Victorville, Hesperia, San Bernardino, Needles and unincorporated County areas, including chipping operations in Wrightwood and illegal dumping operations throughout the High Desert.

"Inmate crews logged 84,894 hours last year, saving taxpayers more than \$2 million," Lovingood said. "These crews spent nine days on the Blue Cut Fire and helped collect 578 tons of trash around the High Desert. Clearly, this is an outstanding program that is making a major impact on our communities."

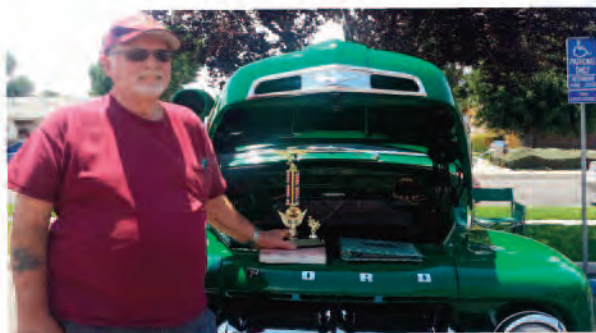
