



Fireworks at the Beach

It's that time of the year again. Our SVLA fireworks event date will be June 24, 2017. As normal, the Public Safety team has a detailed event action plan. We will have a large presence of officers and we are expecting a calm and safe event. In addition, we have communicated with the CHP, Sheriff and volunteer forces to be sure we have as much help as possible. The PSD team would like to remind all residents to be sure you have the correct membership passes for the event. To be clear, the staff has been instructed to not let anyone into the event without proper SVLA cards. Please make arrangements in advance to be sure you are ready for

the event. Also, the beach area opens at 6am. No personal items will be allowed on the beach before opening time. It is also against the rules for residents to "save a spot" and leave items unattended.

In previous years, there were residents concerned that our team was not strictly enforcing the SVLA Rules and Regulations regarding saving spots at the beach. This year we will have staff assigned to identify violators. We thank you in advance for your cooperation and understanding during this event. 

- · Drain your bilge, bait/live wells and other compartments, and then allow to dry completely.
- · Ensure all ropes, tow-lines and anchor lines are dry.
- Please allow vessel to dry for five days prior to entering Spring Valley Lake after being placed upon any other body of fresh water.

PROJECTS AROUND THE COMMUNITY

We have been busy with maintenance items around our community, and just like most of you, we have been very busy trying to keep up with the weeds at all of our properties. June also brings a lot of Association events that require our guys to prepare and plan to provide you with a fun and great event.

But first I wanted to mention a few maintenance projects we have been working on:

- At fishing area 7 we have installed a new irrigation system and installed 900 sq.ft. of sod in an area that was having issues with keeping the grass alive.
- We have cleared 1.4 acres of greenbelt and cleared all v-ditches around the lake.

These are just some of the maintenance items we have been working on this month. If you are interested, every month we post a general overview of items

We have been busy with each department has worked on for that month. You can find these reports on our website by you, we have been very busy going to SVLA.com and clicking to keep up with the weeds

We have just finished the Summer Kick-off and enjoyed the day. The crew planned and worked on the set up and obstacle course to provide a small challenge for the kids. The other big event our crew is busy with is the Family Festival and Firework Show, which requires a lot of planning from all departments to do our best and make sure everything goes as smooth as possible. We are preparing for the electrical needs of our vendors and performers as well as the Fire Departments requirements as they are bringing their seismic simulator called ShakeOut to the festival. We also plan and prep for the evening firework show. Both of these events will be happening on June 24.



OUR LAKE



While these things are all going on, we have finished working on the additional air pump and aeration system at fishing area 10. Building the system in house and using a local manufacturer to build a weather resistant box for the air pump saving the Association hundreds from purchasing a prebuilt system. Currently these 9



aeration pumps help the ecological balance of our lake by using oxygen to move water from the bottom of our lake up through the thermocline and increasing the areas for zooplankton, phytoplankton and fish to live in. Also, the increased levels of oxygen near the bottom increase aerobic bacteria that consumes suspended organics and digest bottom muck.

That is why these air pumps are so important to our lake. We look forward to adding more of these systems to our lake over the years.

We have also replaced a section of wrought iron at the beach and are working on other areas as required.



You may have noticed this sign at the Beach letting you know that every other Wednesday we will be closing the beach at 4pm for chlorine treatments. This is a reminder for you. Thank you for your understanding.

I would also like to remind you

that glass is not permitted at the beach. We have been finding a lot of broken glass recently and would ask that



you please not bring any glass bottles or containers of any kind to the beach area.

As a reminder for boaters, please take note of the lake closure schedule below during the June 24 firework show.





Winning Fitness- Outrunning the Grim Reaper






