CODE ENFORCEMENT

Should you have concerns about vehicles parked on the streets, please con-

tact California Highway Patrol @ (760)241-1186. When you call, have the license plate number, and street address available for them. We realize it is very frustrating that Code Enforcement cannot do anything about this issue. It too is very upsetting for us not to be able to enforce the rule. CHP has taken a hard stand on this issue, and advises they alone can issue notices.

Should you have other calls such as barking dogs, suspicious person, property loss, loud music, yard sales, etc....please contact our Public Safety Dept. @ (760) 245-6400. Dispatch will have an Officer come to your home and take a report. If your concern is about the exterior of the house or the landscaping, please call Code Enforcement.

Communication is

one of the basic bricks

COMMUNICATION

of any relationship. We feel there needs to be better communication between Homeowners and Code Enforcement. Citations are being issued more than ever before. When you receive a Courtesy Notice, please take note of the due date on it. Code will go out and inspect the violation the day after the due date on your notice. If you feel you cannot meet the due date, PLEASE call us and let us know what is going on, and request an extension.

When you do this, you will not receive a citation. Too many of you are waiting until you receive the citation before you communicate with us. The citation means your notice is going to the Citation Review Committee, and then to the Board of Directors for a decision. We are here to help you, and do whatever we can to get the issues at your property resolved. PLEASE, PLEASE COMMUNICATE with us before you receive the citation.

The Community is broken into 3 areas. Each area has its own Code Enforcement Officer. If you are unsure who your officer is, call the Association office and they will let you know. The officers try to become aware of what is going on in their sections, and get to know the residents. This also fosters great communication with Code and Residents. Never hesitate to call Code Enforcement (760) 245-9756, at any time, should you need help or have questions.

Code Enforcement's first concern is that all exterior projects, that involve some change or new addition, have an Architectural Application submitted to us. Even if you're planting a new tree or changing the color of your house trim, you need to contact Eddie Vindas, in the Association office. Eddie is the liaison to the Architectural Committee. He will submit your plan to the committee, and see your project to its completion & final inspection.

The second part of our job is to see that each yard is landscaped well and groomed to meet all our governing documents. Since the first of the year, we have been endeavoring to clean up many eye sores, and bring our Community back to being the "Jewel of the Desert". Many of you have joined our quest in making Spring Valley Lake an awesome iewel again, and we thank you for that. Having the help and support of home owners and tenants, makes the job of Code Enforcement so much easier.

The third scope of our job is to alert you to any repairs and maintenance that may need to be done to the exterior of your home. When you receive a Compliance Request or Courtesy Notice, we are just alerting you to painting issues, roof repairs, fence concerns, and areas that may need debris removed or organized. When working on a project, please do not hesitate to contact us for an extension. Again, Communication is the key to us keeping Spring Valley Lake beautiful.

bring May flowers, and lots of ugly weeds. As we drive around we have observed weeds everywhere. The little rain that we did receive just helped our bumper crop of weeds this spring. Many of you are keeping up with them as best as you can, but others are losing the battle. We've had nice weather the

ing up with them as best as you can, but others are losing the battle. We've had nice weather the last few days, and nicer weather is predicted for the future. That means, it's a good time to get out there and try to win the battle of the weeds.

Should you be the owner of a Vacant Lot, we encourage you to keep the lot clean, and free of all debris. If you have joined our Weed Abatement Program, then we will clean the lot when the weeds reach over 4 inches. We do need to share that the program does not remove trash or debris that has been tossed on it or collected on it.

When you are viewing your lots, should there be any kind of a tree on that lot, it needs to be removed. This is the responsibility of the lot owner. Many of the lots have what we term as "Volunteer Elm Trees", on them. The seeds are carried by birds, rodents and the wind. If the Elm trees get next to a wall, the root system will eventually do some damage to the wall.

Should you receive a Courtesy Notice requesting you to remove trees from your lot, do not be offended. Should you have any questions, please call your Code Officer.



Inspections for Quagga and Zebra Mussels

Quagga and Zebra mussels are an extremely invasive species and the Spring Valley Lake Public Safety Department personnel, including lifeguards, seasonal/beach officers and patrol staff have been performing inspections to avoid any vessel transporting these species from another body of water to ours. Anytime a resident removes their vessel from Spring Valley Lake, a tag will be placed through the 'D-ring' of your vessel and the 'O-ring' of your trailer clip vessel, this will let the Public Safety Department identify if your vessel has been in another body of water. If a vessel does not have one of our

Spring Valley Lake tags on the vessel then an inspection of your vessel will be done. During the inspection, the Public Safety Officer will ask you if you have been in any other bodies of water and check your vessel. All areas must be dry (including live wells) and clear of debris, and no standing water should be on board your vessel in any manner (including bait cans or buckets).

Vessels that are discovered to contain invasive mussels, display the signs of such and/or contain biological presence are subject to a seven day quarantine and will be marked with a red tag. These vessels will not be permitted on Spring Valley Lake until a further inspection by a Public Safety Officer.

Vessel Inspection Information

Inspect Everything!



Whenever you leave freshwater, take the following actions:

- 1. Remove the boat from the water and away from the launch ramp for vessel inspection and cleaning.
- 2. Thoroughly inspect all exposed surfaces on your vessel and trailer. If you find any mussels, scrape them off and kill them by crushing them. Dispose of the remains in the trash. Alert the Department of Fish and Game at 866-440-9530.
- 3. Remove all plants and mud from your boat, trailer, and all equipment. Dispose of all material in the trash.
- 4. Carefully feel your boat's hull for any rough or gritty spots, which may be young mussels that have settled on your vessel and cannot be seen. Microscopic Quagga/Zebra mussels will feel like sandpaper.
- 5. Away from the waterway, wash your boat's hull, trailer, equipment, bilge, and any other exposed surfaces with high-pressure, hot water. When possible use water at a temperature of 140° F (60° C) at the hull or about 155° (68° C) at the nozzle which will kill the mussels. Dry the boat as much as possible.
- 6. Drain all water from your boat (pull all plugs) and dry all areas, including the motor, motor cooling system, live wells, ballast tanks, bladders, bilges, and lower outboard units. Make sure that all life jackets, water skis or other items that have been in the water, including anchors, ropes, etc., are inspected, cleaned, and dried.
- 7. Empty and dry all buckets and dispose of all bait in trash receptacles before you leave. Do not take bait home, or leave it on the ground or dump it in any waterway.
- 8. Thoroughly clean all fishing and recreational equipment (fishing nets, etc).
- 9. Clean and dry personal belongings, clothing, and footwear that have come in contact with the water.
- 10. Wash, dry, and brush pets that have been in the water.
- 11. Keep your watercraft dry for at least five days in warm, dry weather and up to 30 days in cool, moist weather before launching into freshwater.
