SVLA BOARD PRESIDENT

RORY SHANNON

By now you have heard that your Board has approved the 2019-2020 budget. While most of the budget included standard increases relative to increasing costs, one area stands out and as something different.

Everyone knows that one of our most important assets is our lake. The lake is the center of our community not only in use, but aesthetically also. The health of our lake determines our enjoyment of this asset and has an impact on the value of our homes. A beautiful functioning lake will add value to our community. In contrast, a poorly functioning lake will have a negative impact on our home values.

The association has always sought to keep the water clear in our lake. However, in the last few years, the entire State of California has had a problem with Harmful Algae Blooms. This is not unique to Spring Valley Lake. Recently, Silverwood Lake had to be closed because of this problem. We are additionally challenged in that the water that leaves our lake ends up in the Mojave River, which is a U.S. Waterway. All treatments must be approved and that is a difficult process, if even possible.

Our association is very fortunate

to have an excellent Lake Committee that is working with staff to bring solutions for our lake. Under their guidance, we have already built one filter that is cleaning the water. We are in the process of building more; but filters only cure the symptom and not the cause. The Lake Committee has researched an additional solution that involves adding plant "islands" that will further combat the problem naturally; which brings us back to our budget.

The solution for the "plant islands" was proposed at \$120,000. That is a lot of money. However, at the time of approving the budget, your board did not believe we had enough information and documentation to approve that project. We are confident that the Lake Committee will provide further information and documentation so that we can approve at a later date. Waiting until next year's budget process appeared to be problematic, as we need to move quicker than that.

The solution the board chose was to assess for that \$120,000, but not release any funds until the board approves the proposal. This allows us to have the money ready for a January start date if approved. If we do not approve

the proposal, the money allocated can either: not be spent, used for the coving project, or some other solution. Your board believes this to be the most prudent course of action.

Another issue that surfaced during this discussion was our budget committee and planning committee process. We lack a clearly defined procedure for projects such as this to go through a planning and budget process and committee. With that said, we have tasked the existing Budget Committee to

immediately begin work on creating a process so that other groups will know how and when to submit their projects for approval. Upon completion of that work, we will coordinate with the Planning Committee to likewise update their process to work with the budget committee.

Budget & 2020 Goals

I want to thank the residents who were able to make it to the budget meeting. If you missed the meeting, here is a recap of the additions regarding staff and compensation:

Maintenance needs:

- Two seasonal maintenance workers – Memorial day – Labor day
- One part-time maintenance worker – Up to 29 hours a week
- Two maintenance workers will be identified as supervisors. They will receive a slight pay increase to reflect their increased responsibilities.

Public safety needs:

- One part-time officer – Up to 29 hours a week.

Code Enforcement needs:

- One code enforcement employee will be identified, as a supervisor. They will receive a slight pay increase to reflect their increased responsibility.

Notes: Minimum wage - \$12.00 to \$13.00 an hour.

- We need to increase the wages of approximately twenty-five (25) seasonal staff members in order to keep up with the minimum wage. (Please keep in mind that this will go up by \$1.00 for approximately the next two years...)

They witnessed the expert separation of our trash into its usable/recyclable components of plastic, glass, metals, wood, green waste, e-waste, compost, cement, paper, and organic matter. Thanks to JoAnne Romero for organizing the tour! Here are some interesting facts about Advance Disposal:

- Trash cans will be grey in color from now on. The State of CA determines the colors.
- Advance Disposal is a 3rd generation family owned and operated business. Robert and Donna Bath founded Advance Disposal in 1965.
- Cities in CA are required to reduce their total waste stream by 75% in 2020. Advance Disposal has already met this requirement.
- Compost that is generated at Advance Disposal is purchased by local farmers.

This summer season went by so fast; and it was an awesome summer thanks to all the seasonal officers and lifeguards that did an outstanding job keeping all the amenities in Spring Valley Lake safe for all the residents. This year we had four seasonal officers helping our full time officers with checking all the amenities. They also assisted with responding to the many different calls that the department received during the day, conducting vessel inspection, launching and retrieving vessels at the boat ramp and helping with the many functions that take place during the summer. This season we had 13 lifeguards that did an outstanding job watching the beach area for all the children in and around the water. They also checked over 10,000

valid Spring Valley Lake ID's at the gates from May through August and rented out over 211 life jackets to any resident that needed one. The lifeguards do daily and bi-weekly training to keep up on their skills that are needed for being a lifeguard; like assisting any resident at the beach area with their first aid needs or rescuing someone that is struggling in the water. I want to give a huge thank you to all staff for a great season.

Please remember:

Starting September 3rd, the lake will close at 10:00 p.m. Please remember, the maximum speed for vessels on the lake shall be five miles per hour (no-wake) starting at sunset daily.

What is the SVL-CSD?

The Spring Valley Lake Community Service District (known as the SVL-CSD) is a proposed governing body that, once ratified by the voters in the local service area, will manage certain services currently managed by County Service Area 64 (known as CSA-64).

Is the SVL-CSD connected to the Spring Valley Lake Association or the SVLA Board of Directors?

The SVL-CSD has **nothing at all** to do with the Spring Valley Lake Association or the SVLA Board of Directors. It is a completely separate entity created to replace County managed CSA-64, putting the management of these services in the hands of our local elected officials.

Why should we vote to change from CSA-64 to a CSD?

Currently, our tax dollars and service fees are being managed by CSA-64 which is comprised of people, outside of our service area, who may not have a vested interest in our community. We believe it is in our best interest to elect local candidates who will sit on a Board and make decisions based upon local need. This will allow our money to be spent in areas that will directly benefit the residents within our service area and not filter into a budget line item which supports multiple CSA's within the County of San Bernardino.

How can I help make this vision a reality?

We encourage your support by voting "YES" to approve the formation of the Spring Valley Lake CSD on the November 2020 ballot. We also encourage you to share this information with your family, friends and neighbors who live within the proposed service area. 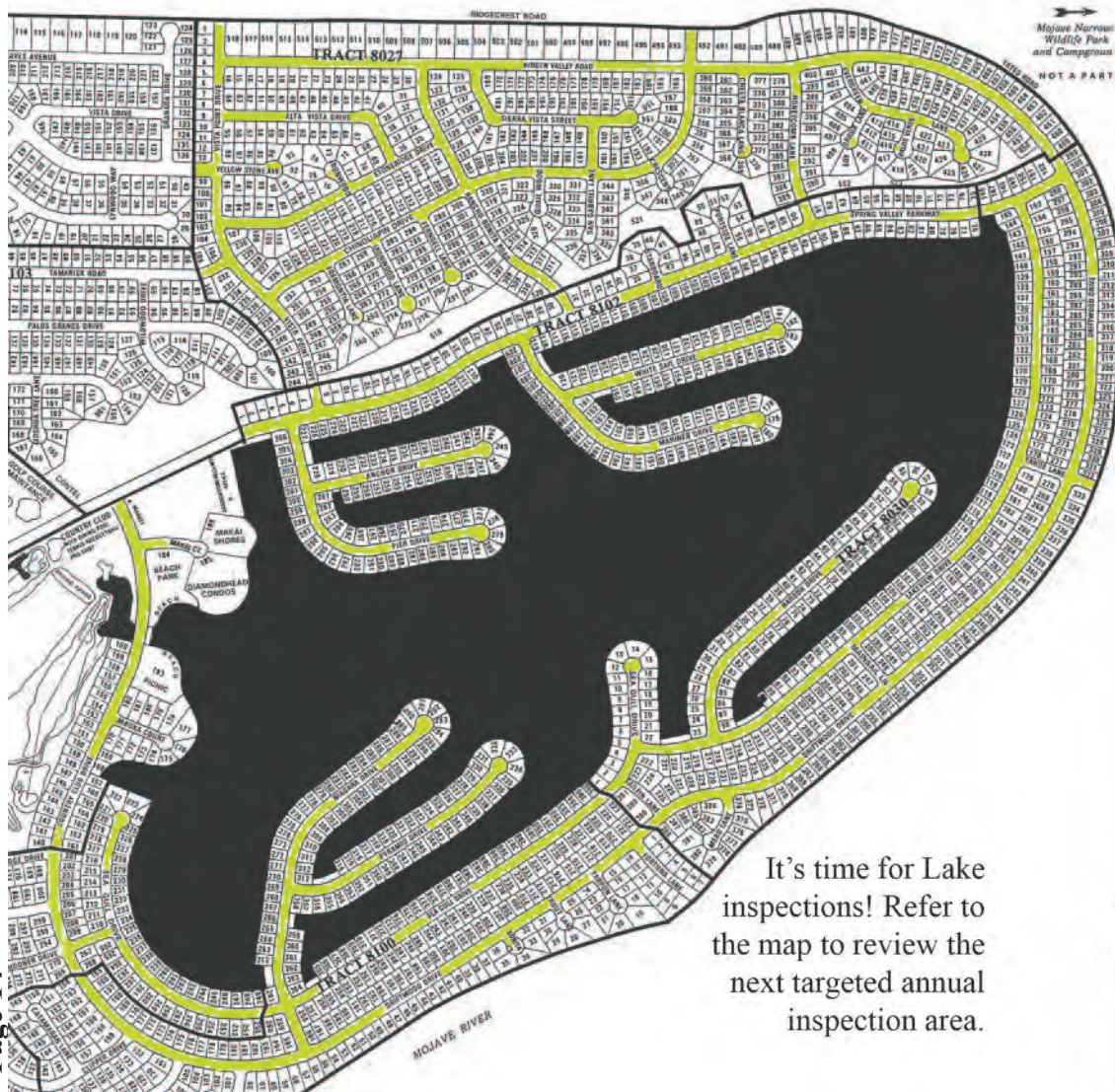
mountains. When I am not outdoors, I spend my time as a worship leader at my church where I also play the guitar.

Equestrian Estates

We have completed the irrigation and planting of the requested and approved trees. We have placed an order for Bermuda hay for our boarded horses, and we have our expert Dirt Doctor scheduled to address our main arena and continue to train our staff on proper arena care and equipment use.

Sale of Vehicles and Vessel

OUR LAKE



We have started installation of a second filter system that will be installed on the opposite side of the lake, specifically at FA9, which is on Lakeview between Mainsail and Sea Gull. We are preparing some data sheets showing the difference between lake samples and filter samples. We will post these sheets on our website under the "Amenities" tab "Lake".

We have already placed our Trout order that we get from Jess Ranch Lake and the Hatchery. The delivery dates will be:
November 19, 2019—2,000lbs.
December 17, 2019—2,000lbs.
February 4, 2020—1,000lbs.

We have also placed orders for feeders for our predator fish.
7,500 Rosey Red Minnows

7,500 Crappie Shiners
1,000 crayfish

And, we have placed orders for fish, that will help control our snails and leaches.

3,000 Red Ear sunfish

1,500 Crappie sunfish

These fish will be delivered first week of March 2020.

I also just wanted to reach out to the community and let you know that I will no longer be here as Director of Operations. I have taken a position with High Desert Church. My family and I are so excited that I will be working for God and devote more of my attention to His community. I have enjoyed being Director of Operations since 2011, working with this talented team here at

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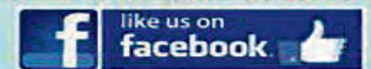
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The SVL Veterans Club

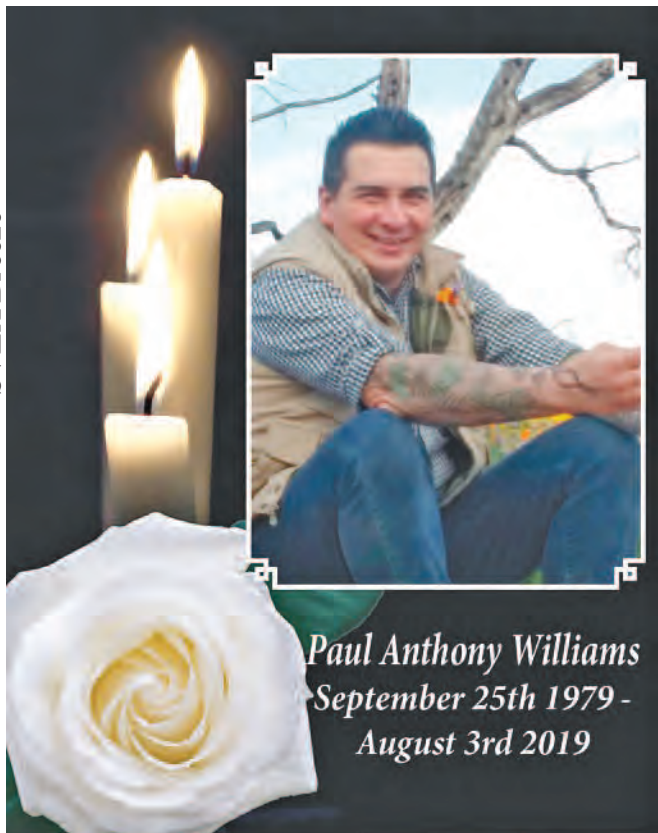
