




There are two additional restroom quotes scheduled for January and two handwashing stations ordered for the Play Fair and Long Acre parks. An updated design has been submitted for the bridges which have fallen into disrepair, and we are requesting roofing contractors for the upcoming roof replacement at the Maintenance Building, Equestrian Center and Community Building. It's good to see our association working on maintaining the current structures. Our Equestrian Center has been a gathering place for the Hoe Down, EQ meetings and other community-based activities. We are looking forward to all that is being done to keep the center structurally sound and ready for the High Desert weather.

E-Bike CLASSIFICATIONS

CLASS 1

PEDAL ASSIST

<20 MPH

A "class 1 electric bicycle," or "low-speed pedal-assisted electric bicycle," is a bicycle equipped with a motor that provides assistance only when the rider is pedaling, and that ceases to provide assistance when the bicycle reaches the speed of 20 miles per hour.



CLASS 2

THROTTLE ASSIST

<20 MPH

A "class 2 electric bicycle," or "low-speed throttle-assisted electric bicycle," is a bicycle equipped with a motor that may be used exclusively to propel the bicycle, and that is not capable of providing assistance when the bicycle reaches the speed of 20 miles per hour.



CLASS 3

PEDAL ASSIST

<28 MPH

A "class 3 electric bicycle," or "speed pedal-assisted electric bicycle," is a bicycle equipped with a motor that provides assistance only when the rider is pedaling, and that ceases to provide assistance when the bicycle reaches the speed of 28 miles per hour, and equipped with a speedometer.



Additionally, to operate a Class 3 E-Bike you must:

• Be 16 years of age or older

• Wear a helmet, regardless of age

No driver's license is required. Per California Vehicle Code Section 21212, **riders under the age of 18 must wear a helmet, regardless of bicycle type.**

Any purchased or modified E-Bike that can travel at speeds above 28 miles per hour is no longer considered an E-Bike, and is considered an "out of class electric vehicle" which is illegal to operate on public roadways.

Tampering with or modifying your E-bike battery or speed settings could result in an illegal modification leading to potential injury or death.

A Reminder from Public Safety

Per SVLA Rules and Regulations Section 3.3: Dogs and other domesticated animals are allowed in the following common areas:

- Fishing Areas
- Meadowlark Park Grass Area and Off-Leash Area
 - Playfair Park Grass Area
 - Long Acres Park Grass Area
 - Equestrian Center
 - Marina Grass Area
- In or on boats on the lake

All dogs or other domesticated animals are required to be kept on a leash no longer than 6' at all times. Owners are required to immediately clean up any feces generated by their pet. Feces must be put in a tightly sealed plastic bag before being disposed of. Using paper bags to dispose of feces is strictly prohibited.

Dogs and other domesticated animals are prohibited in the following common areas:

- Lake
- Beaches and Swim Area
- Playground areas in each park
 - Equestrian Trails

Any dog or other domesticated animal that is creating a disturbance or exhibiting violent or aggressive behavior must be removed from the area immediately by its caretaker.

Guest Passes

Guest Passes

All Property Owners and Tenant Members receive a maximum of four (4) guest passes per property.

In the event that more guest passes are needed, the member can request up to 6 additional One-Day passes for the day they are needed. Be advised, One-Day passes cannot be used on certain event days. One-Day passes can be issued a maximum of four (4) times per fiscal year as long as the member's account is in good standing.

If Members require 25 passes or more, they can request wristbands from the Association Office for everyone in their group aged 3 and older. When requesting wristbands, Association Staff requires a minimum of 1 months' notice and a one-day event binder is required.
